Follow up on Foreign Medical Team

Only 18 foreign Medical team were contacted in the field today (*others could not be due to connection problem with the mobile*)

- Most of the contacted Foreign Medical Team have been working and/or started to work in the deployed areas.
- Some FMTs have completed their agreed duration and returning back from areas of deployment (eg. Dhaap, Jambu, Maniswara VDC).
- Some of the FMT have increased the duration of stay
- There are minor discrepancies among the deployed and their working area.
