The meeting of the HuMOCC took place at the Multinational Military Coordination Center (MNMCC) on Wednesday 6 May at 9am. The meeting agenda was the following:

Key discussion points

1. Situation Update (OCHA)

The latest figures from the GoN: 7,557 deaths and 14,536 injuries (as of 1:30pm on Wednesday 05 May), Buildings fully damaged: GoN: 10718 Civilian: 191,058. Buildings partially damaged: GoN: 14741 civilian: 175,162.

UNHAS assets available in country that can be tasked following the identification of needs: Two UNHAS MI8 helicopters are in country and can be tasked with cargo (2 - 2.5MT cargo capacity); One AS 350 UNHAS helicopter is available for assessment missions (max 4 passengers); Four additional air assets have been earmarked and are being made available and will be operational in the coming two weeks. <https://www.humanitarianresponse.info/en/operations/nepal>.

There will be a turn-over of staff in the Nepalese Army at the MNMCC. Colonel PK will be replaced by Col Rajesh Chand. The UN-CMCoord team will be advocating to continue with the current good working relations and humanitarian liaison in the MNMCC.

2. Security Update (UNDSS)

No major incidents reported. A landslide was reported by the national police in Rasuwa-al-Mailung. The road at this point is only partially passable. Heavy equipment will be needed to open up the road quickly. A system is being put in place to facilitate the submission of information related to access limitations or other security incidents. 3. Debriefing on MNMCC Meeting

OCHA/Log Cluster is advocating with the Nepalese Army to establish an integrated planning cell within the MNMCC that can: 1. Enable an integrated response in support of the Government of Nepal; 2. Ensure joint situational awareness; 3. De-conflict support operations in the same geographical area of operations; 4. Provide a single entry point to prioritize and task requests from the HC to access national /foreign military efforts in support of the GoN. This last task will be performed in line with global (Oslo) and regional guidelines (APC MADRO). The proposal was discussed with the highest rank of the Nepalese army in the MNMCC and WFP/Log Cluster on Wednesday 06 May and the final endorsement should be transmitted shortly.

4. Feedback from the participants (issues and challenges)

A humanitarian partner raised the issue of Medevac and Casevac and the need for a procedure put in place for NGOs. UNDSS is going to provide more information on an LTA that has been signed for UN agencies and whether this could be put in place also for the NGO community. Information was also shared by one humanitarian partner about problems encountered for the distribution of material. The UN-CMCoord team facilitated the liaison with the national police to reevaluate the issue.
