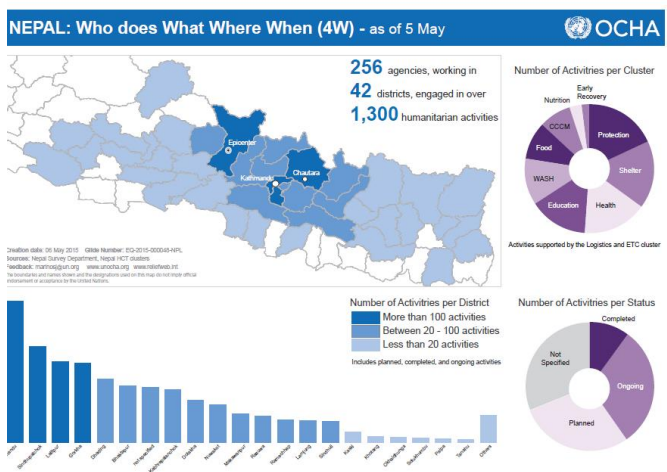

## Key discussion points

### 1. Situation Update (OCHA)



➤ The Government and humanitarian partners have now reached all affected districts and are refining information on needs of affected people, particularly in remote and hard-to-reach areas.

➤ New Government figures show that the number of houses destroyed in the earthquake-affected districts is at least twice as high as previously reported.

➤ The Ministry of Health and Population (MOHP) mobilized 274 national medical teams (NMT).

➤ The Central Natural Disaster Relief Committee (CNDRC) released 1.79 billion Nepalese Rupees (equivalent to approximately US\$ 17.3 million) to support relief activities at the district level.

The Nepalese military is in the process of finalizing the deployment of half a platoon in all the VDCs of the 16 affected districts. This means that a total of 10,000 troops are going to be deployed in these areas to support relief efforts,

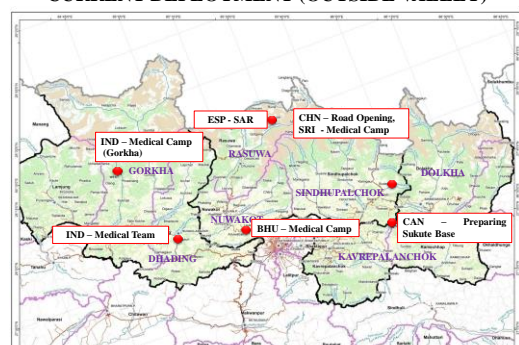
### Update on air assets

#### 1. Assets available in country

WFP/Log Cluster: 2x UNHAS MI8 helicopter are in country and can be tasked with cargo (2 - 2.5MT cargo capacity);

1x AS 350 UNHAS helicopter is available for assessment missions (max 4 passengers); 4x additional air assets (MI8 helicopter ) have been earmarked and are being made available and will be operational in the coming two weeks. MAF is also bringing in 2 additional small aircrafts as part of the Logistics Cluster.

#### CURRENT DEPLOYMENT (OUTSIDE VALLEY)



Nepal: 12 Helicopters ; India: 13 military helicopters 8 x medium twin-turbine transport helicopter (MI17), 5 x advanced light Helicopter (ALH) ; China: 3 x MI17 helicopters; USA: 1 x C-17 Globemaster III; 4x V-22 Osprey multi-mission tiltrotor aircraft; 2 x UH-1 helicopter (1x UH-1 helicopter in the pipeline); UK (pending permission to enter the Nepalese air space): 1 x C130 aircraft; 3 x Boeing CH-47 Chinook (CH47).

## 2. Air Assets delivering cargo on a regular basis but not positioned in the country:

India: 13 military aircraft\* large military transport aircraft C-17, Ilyushin Il-76 (IL-76), C-130

China: 3 x IL-76 aircraft ; Pakistan: 4 x Lockheed C-130 Hercules (C-130); Russia: 2 x Ilyushin IL-76

Sri Lanka: 1x C-130 aircraft ; Bangladesh: 1 x C-130 aircraft

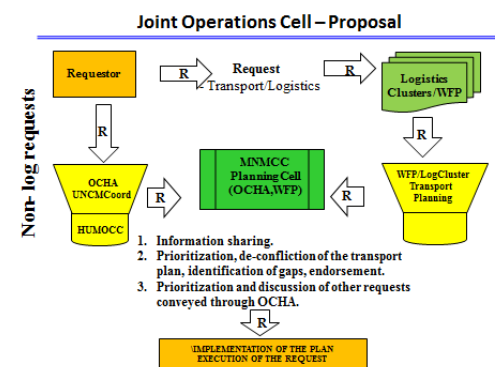

## 2. Security Update (UNDSS)

No major incidents reported. A landslide was reported by the national police in Mailung (Rasuwa-Nuwakat). The road at this point is only partially passable. Heavy equipment will be needed to open up the road quickly. A system is being put in place to facilitate the submission of information related to access limitations or other security incidents. ## 3. Debriefing on MNMCC Meeting



OCHA/Log Cluster is advocating with the Nepalese Army to establish an integrated planning cell within the MNMCC that can:

1. Ensure joint situational awareness;
2. De-conflict support operations in the same geographical area of operations;
3. Provide a single entry point to prioritize and task requests from the Humanitarian Community to access national /foreign military efforts in support of the GoN. This last task will be performed in line with global (Oslo) and regional guidelines (APC MADRO). The proposal was discussed with the highest rank of the Nepalese army in the MNMCC and WFP/Log Cluster on Wednesday 06 May and the final endorsement should be transmitted shortly.

## 4. Feedback from the participants (issues and challenges)

A humanitarian partner raised the issue of Medevac and Casevac and the need for a procedure put in place for NGOs. UNDSS is going to provide more information on an LTA that has been signed for UN agencies and whether this could be put in place also for the NGO community. Information was also shared by one humanitarian partner about problems encountered for the distribution of material. The UN-CMCoord team facilitated the liaison with the national police to resolve the issue.

## 5. AOB

The next HuMoCC meeting is scheduled to take place on Friday 08 May at 9am at the MNMCC. As of next week the frequency of the HuMOCC meetings will be three times a week.
