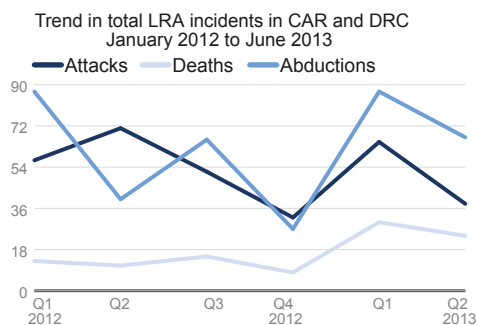


Overview

Total LRA incidents reported in Q2 of 2013 declined slightly over Q1. While DRC recorded a significant decrease in attacks, deaths and abductions in Q2, CAR reported a substantial increase in number of casualties and abductions. The trend in CAR could be attributed to better access to information in Q2 than in Q1 2013.

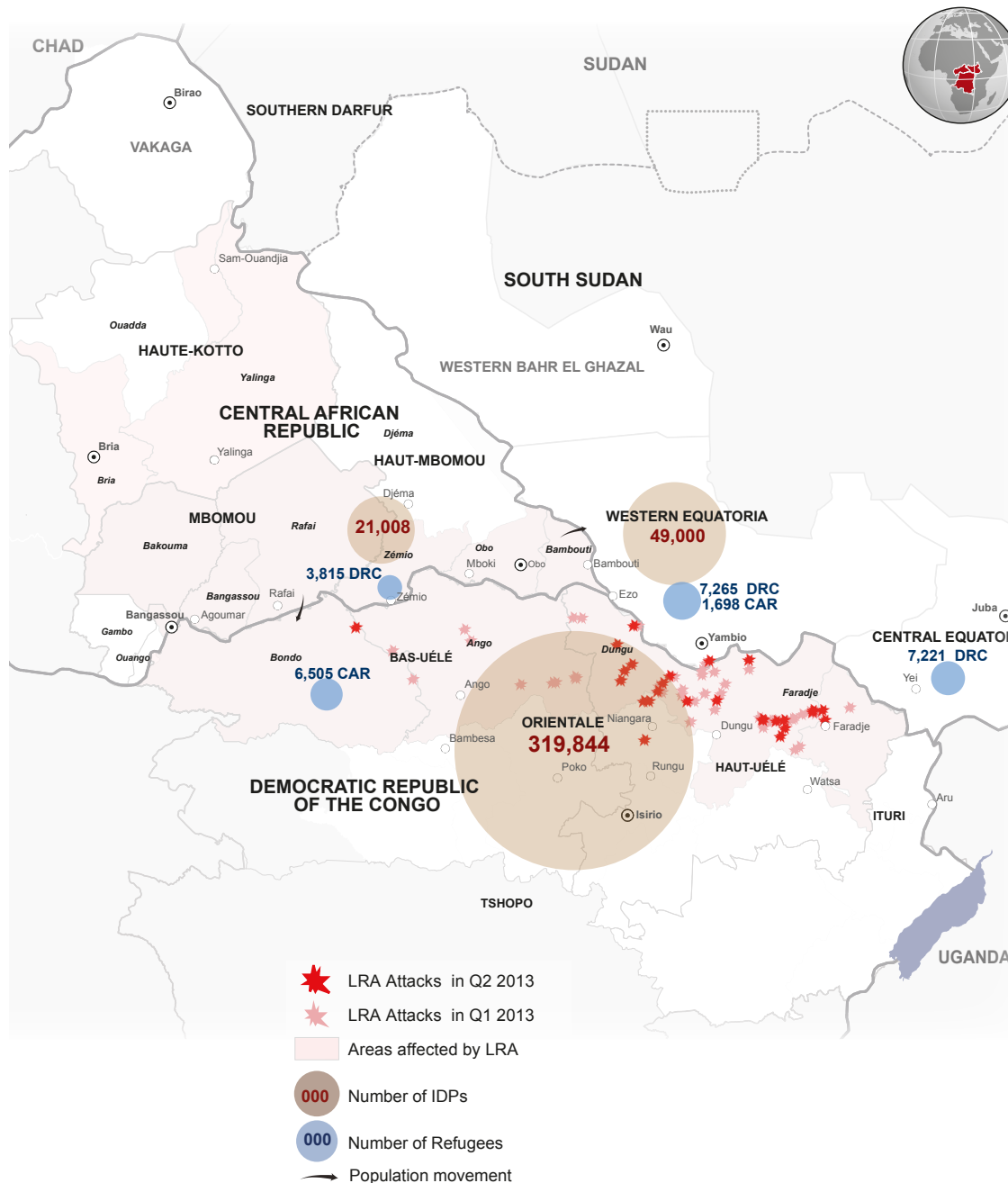


Overall, 38 LRA attacks were reported in Q2 (a 42% decrease from Q1) resulting in 24 deaths and 67 abductions. The majority of the attacks (30) happened in DRC, while CAR recorded the highest number of deaths (20) and abductions (60).

Over 416,000 people remain displaced from their homes in LRA-affected areas of CAR, DRC and South Sudan. This is a slight decrease (1%) from Q1.

Displacements in LRA-affected areas in DRC, CAR and South Sudan as of 30 June 2013

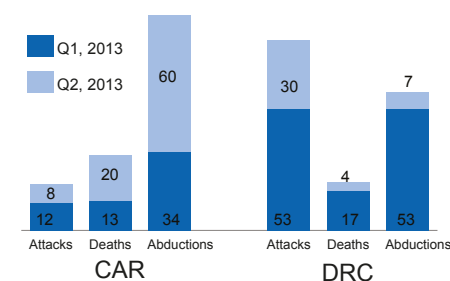

Democratic Rep. of the Congo

In Q2 of 2013, a total of 30 presumed LRA attacks, 4 deaths and 7 abductions were reported in the DRC. The majority of the attacks continue to occur in Dungu territory (63%) of Haut Uélé district in Orientale Province. Overall, the reported LRA incidents in DRC declined in Q2 as compared to Q1 of 2013. An estimated 320,000 people remain displaced in Orientale Province, which also hosts 6,505 CAR refugees. Efforts are underway to obtain better estimates of IDPs as some partners consider these figures outdated.

Central African Republic

In CAR, a total of 8 attacks, 20 deaths and 60 abductions were reported in Q2 of 2013. Most of the attacks reported were in Haut-Kotto Préfecture. The number of displaced in LRA-affected areas remains at 21,000 but requires verification when the situation in CAR stabilizes. In addition, 3,815 DRC refugees remain hosted in Haut-Mbomou with a majority (3,225) being in Zémio camp. Insecurity and lack of humanitarian access still persists in CAR, thus LRA reporting remained a challenge in Q2 of 2013.

South Sudan

There have been no reports of alleged LRA attacks in South Sudan since Q3 of 2011. However, 49,000 persons remain displaced as a result of prior LRA attacks. South Sudan hosts 14,486 DRC and 1,698 CAR refugees.
