

INTERAGENCY RAPID NEEDS ASSESSMENT

IDP influx in Walgak, Yidit, Boung and Diror villages - Akobo West (Akobo County)

INTRODUCTION

On the 9th of January 2014 thousands of IDPs amounting to 7,500(HH) arrived from Bor and Malakal, to Walgak, Boung, Diror and Yidit Payams of Akobo West following this horrible situation which has erupted on 15 Dec 2013. That has lost many lives of innocent people. Consequently to this an interagency rapid needs assessment was initiated. This assessment was conducted on 13 Jan 2013.

Displaced population arrived in Walgak:

Walgak IDPs from Bor:

- 960 (Females)
 - 950 (males)
 - 1090 (children)
- Total 3000

NB – Information provided by Sub-chief of displaced people. There are new arrivals every day, the assessment team observed approx. 450 per day

IDPs from Malakal

- 2,100 (females)
- 1,300 (males)
- 1,100 children (based on 5 per HH)

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NB: NGO capacity in Akobo West is limited both in logistical terms and human resource terms. There is very little capacity to expand beyond the current programming to incorporate an emergency response without further funding identified or general support.

Key Priorities

- **Food insecurity** – Food distribution (further detailed assessment needed).
- **Health:** there is need for drugs and personnel due to the high number of wounded civilians and sickness reported
- **Protection:** high need to control the random shooting in community
- **Nutrition** – Blanket feeding program to all under 5. Minimum dry food provided to mothers.
- **NFI / ES** –Mosquito nets and jerry can distribution to all displaced HH. Further detailed assessment for ES provision.
- **WASH** – Emergency HP campaign and distribution of hygiene kits (soap at a minimum)
