### 2. Assessment Finding and Recommendation in brief:

Takhar has historically been a province to receive significant numbers of conflict displaced IDPs from Kunduz. This assessment report covers a caseload of conflict displaced IDPs from Kunduz, as well as a selection of HHs that have been recently displaced by conflict in several districts of Takhar. The breakdown of the caseload can be found in the table above.

71% of the caseload reports unskilled labour as their primary income source. 17% of the caseload reports farming as their primary source of income. The remaining 12% reports vocations such as police, tailor, driver, carpenter, shopkeeper. 71% of the caseload reports no debts, 20% report debts between 2,000-8,000 AFN, 3% report debts of more than 8,000 AFN, and 3% report debts less than 2000 AFN. At present, 100% of the households report that they have not yet received assistance. The proposed distribution is planned for 07/08/17.

#### Recommendations:

UNHCR will be providing NFIs in kind, and ACTED will support the remaining needs with multi-purpose cash of 26,000 AFN in total per household.

100% of the caseload has prioritized food as their primary need. 55% of the caseload reports eating 3 complete meals per day, 44% report consuming 2 complete meals per day. 100% of the caseload reports having no food stocks at present. 32% of the caseload reports reducing portions sizes between 1-5 days per week. 32% of the caseload also reports restricting consumption by adults so children can eat between 1-5 days per week. 29% of the caseload reports borrowing food between 1-3 days per week to meet their food needs.

**Recommendation:**

ACTED will support in covering food needs through multi-purpose cash assistance.

100% of the caseload has reported the loss of kitchen items, 89% has reported the loss of blankets, 90% has reported the loss of hygiene items, and 29% has reported the loss of water containers. NFIs were indicated as the second priority need for 51% of households, and the third priority need for 48% of households.

**Recommendation:**

UNHCR will provide in-kind NFI support.

**C) Shelter:** *(please provide detailed information about the status of shelter condition i.e. type of normal shelters, # of shelters moderately damaged, severely damaged and completely destroyed by crises. 84% of the caseload reports that the status of their shelter/compound is unharmed. 14% report partial destruction. At present, 32% of the caseload is reporting hosting, 47% is reporting rental housing, 14% is reporting 'other', and 5% is reporting a tent, with the remaining 2% in an open area. For those renting, the average rental cost is reported to be 1,429 AFN per month.

**Recommendation:**

ACTED will provide multi-purpose cash to cover shelter needs.

92% of the caseload reports access to drinking water, 98% report access to bathing water, and 100% report access to cooking water. 100% of the caseload reports that there are no limitations in access to water. Primary water sources are reported to be: handpump (53%), dug well (66%), stream/river (12%), kandas (4%), pipe water (2%), and spring (1%). The average time to get to a water source is reported to be 4.4 minutes. 86% of the caseload reports stability in access to water.

89% of the caseload reports access to a latrine, with the latrine type indicated as family pit latrine (64%), and community latrine (36%).

**Recommendation:**

DACAAR will support the caseload with in-kind assistance for WASH needs.

6 HHs indicated having more than 1 vulnerability.

**Recommendation:**

No families were referred by assessment teams for additional protection assistance.

Health was indicated as the third priority need for 3% of the caseload. There were no further health needs indicated

**Recommendation:**

98% of the caseload reports access to markets to meet their household needs. 100% of the caseload reported that access was not limited by threats. Average distance to market was reported as 4.5 km, with an average travel time of 24 minutes.

#### 4. Urgent Priority needs of affected people (as per affected point of view)

100% of the caseload has indicated food to be their first priority need. Second priority needs comprise of NFIs (51%), shelter (48%), and WASH (1%). Third priority needs were reported as NFIs (48%), WASH (49%), and health (3%).

**Recommendations:**

UNHCR will provide in-kind NFI support. ACTED will assist with the remaining needs through multipurpose cash assistance.

**Challenges:**

There are no anticipated challenges with the response to this caseload.
