2. Assessment Finding and Recommendation in brief:

The following assessment report covers a caseload of conflict displaced IDPs in Kunduz district. Kunduz has recently experienced consistent conflict within the district, and from neighbouring districts into Kunduz district itself. The assessment covers 79 families displaced by conflict within Kunduz district, and 5 families that were assessed in Ali Abad. The assessment took place between 24/07/17-27/07/17. 88% of the caseload report farming as their primary income source, with 5% reporting unskilled labour, and the remaining 6% reporting either doctor, government staff, shopkeeper, or driver. 30% of the caseload reports debts between 2,000-8,000 AFN. 37% report debts below 2,000 AFN, 23% report no debts, and 11% report debts of more than 8,000. 100% of the caseload reports that they have not yet received any assistance.

Recommendations:

Field coordination has determined that WFP will provide 2 months of food, SCI will cover NFIs in-kind, DACAAR will provide hygiene kits in-kind, and ACTED will provide multi-purpose cash for the remaining needs, for a total of 14000 AFN per household.

99% of the caseload reported food to be their first priority need. 69% of the caseload reports eating 3 complete meals per day, with 31% reporting consuming 2 complete meals per day. 99% of the caseload reports being able to cook food. 98% of the caseload reports relying on less preferred/expensive food between 1-5 days of the week. 99% of the caseload reports borrowing food between 1-6 days of the week. 99% of the caseload reports that they are limiting portion sizes at mealtimes.

38% of the caseload reports no food stocks, 55% reports less than a week of food stocks, 6% reports between 1-3 weeks of food stocks, and 1% report up to 3 months.

Recommendation:

WFP will be supporting the caseload with 2 months of in-kind food assistance.

87% of the caseload has reported the loss of kitchen items. 95% of the caseload has reported the loss of blankets, 86% has reported the loss of hygiene items, and 23% has reported the loss of water containers. NFIs were reported to be the second priority need for 10% of the caseload, and the third priority need for 88% of the caseload.

Recommendation:

SCI will be providing NFI support in-kind to the caseload.

C) Shelter: *(please provide detailed information about the status of shelter condition i.e. type of normal shelters, # of shelters moderately damaged, severely damaged and completely destroyed by crises. How many people live in open space, sheltered with host families, etc. What kind of shelter support/assistance is needed and for how many families?). Are there land ownership issues?)*

64% of the caseload has reported the status of their compound/shelter as partially destroyed. 35% report there is no harm, and less than 1% report complete destruction to the shelter/compound. At present, 99% of the caseload is being hosted as their current accommodation. The one household reporting renting is paying 1,000 AFN for their rental housing.

Recommendation:

ACTED will support in covering shelter needs through multipurpose cash assistance.

D) WASH: *(provide detailed information about Water sources, affected water source, sanitation (latrines, used water and solid waste management) and hygiene issues. What is recommended in WASH sector and when?)*

100% of the caseload has reported access to drinking, cooking, and bathing water. 100% of the caseload also reports that there are no limitations in the access to this water. At present 62% of the caseload is reporting a handpump as their primary water source, 38% is reporting a dug well, and 2% is reporting a stream/river. The average time to travel to a water source is reported to be 5 minutes.

100% of the caseload report latrine availability, with 46% reporting a community latrine, and 54% reporting a family pit latrine. 100% reported using a latrine the last time they defecated.

Recommendation:

DACAAR will be supporting the caseload through in-kind WASH assistance.

None of the households in the assessment reported having more than 1 vulnerability. No families were referred by assessment teams for additional services.

Recommendation:

There is no protection response recommended for this caseload.

Health was the third priority need for 4% of the caseload. There was no further health information collected by assessment teams.

Recommendation:

There is no recommended health response to this caseload.

H) MARKET ASSESSMENT: *(provide summary information regarding the local market, accessibility, security constrains and fill the table if an market assessment has been conducted)*

98% of the caseload reports access to a market to meet their household needs. 82% report that access is not restricted by threats, which 18% report some restrictions. Of this number, 9 HHs report security restrictions, with the remaining 6 HHs reporting physical constraints. The average distance to market is reported to be 10.8 km, with an average travel time of just under 38 minutes.

4. Urgent Priority needs of affected people (as per affected point of view)

Food was the first priority need for 99% of the caseload, with 1% reporting shelter as their primary need. Second priority needs include shelter (90%), and NFIs (10%). Third priority needs were reported as: NFIs (88%), shelter (6%), health (4%), and food (2%).

Recommendations:

As mentioned, the response has been coordinated as follows: WFP 2 months of food assistance, DACAAR in-kind WASH response, ACTED multipurpose cash assistance (14,000 AFN).

Challenges:

There are no anticipated challenges with this caseload.
