2. Assessment Finding and Recommendation in brief:

On 15 June 2017, DoRR referred a caseload of IDPs for the need assessment and response.

The families were displaced from Chaparhar and Pachir Agam district of Nangarhar province due to aggression of ISIS(DAESH). The families were suffered a lot because of ongoing fights started in the areas. The fighting got longer and the families compelled to leave the area.

As it was critical situation so they left livelihood and all assets just saved the lives and currently suffering from the lack of food and home appliance so they are in need of emergency assistance.

Recommendations:

Based on the team's findings after the assessment, the affected families are living in poor conditions and recommended for emergency assistance.

3. Sectorial Issues:

A) Food Security, Nutrition and Livelihood:

100% of the families are in urgent need of food assistance as 75% reported having stocks for less than a week. 100% of the beneficiaries reported to have eaten 3 complete meals per day meanwhile, 100% of the assessed households report that they use nor or low coping mechanisms.

The most common current source of income amongst interviewed households was unskilled labor (65% of households), followed by teacher (12%) while (24%) are jobless. 24% of the households currently have no income source, while 65% of households have an income of up to 5000 AFN. 12% of the households have income between 5000 and 10000. 29% of the households had no debts, 71% had debts of less than 2000 AFN.

Recommendation:

As seems the families are food insecure and with no or low income, so, they are recommended for food assistance and NRC will provide them with two months' cash for food.

NFI:

As the families are displaced in bad situations so, they left home appliances in place of origin and couldn't bring any things with them, so 100% of beneficiaries have reported to have lost kitchen items. 100% of the assessed households reported losing hygiene items. 100% reported losing blankets and no family reported losing water containers.

Recommendation:

100% of the families were recommended for NFI by joint assessment team, so they will be provided with cash for kitchen items and hygiene item In-kind by NRC.

B) Shelter:

47% of the households are living with host families while 53 of the households are living in rented houses. No family is living in open area. The average rent paid by households who were living in rented accommodation is 1500 AFN per month. The average rent of the households who were living in rented accommodation, 89% reported paying 2000 AFN or less per month in rent, while 22% are paying more than 2000AFN.

Recommendation:

Cash for shelter is recommended as according to joint assessment findings, providing of shelter support in the form of cash would allow affected households to either compensate their host families or to rent an accommodation

C) WASH:

100% reported having access to enough water for Drinking, Cooking and bathing, the average time to get to the water point is 0 minutes. Meanwhile 100% of the beneficiaries have reported to have access to latrines. But still the need to improve the family hygiene was felt.

Recommendation:

As per the assessment team recommendation, in-kind hygiene kits are recommended.

D) Protection:

There were no case of death or injury reported, meanwhile no case of some being separated from their family, there are no hazards threatening these households in the current place as well.

2 households were identified as particularly vulnerable for extra assistance.

Recommendation:

The families with high level of vulnerability to be further investigated and referred to a service provider for further support if needed.

E) Health:

The families have access to local clinics and health service. no case of health issues was found during the assessment.

G) MARKET ASSESSMENT:

In general, access to markets is not a problem as 100% of the beneficiaries stated that they have access to the nearest markets. The average time taken to access the market is 13 Minutes covering an average distance of 1 Kilo Meters meanwhile there is sufficient food stock available in the market whereas no security constraint available. The price for food commodities in the market are in acceptable status.

4. Urgent Priority needs of affected people (as per affected point of view)

As the families have lost their livelihood, food, and non-food items and as per their household condition; the team identified their needs as food, NFIs and Hygiene and have recommended them for emergency assistance.

Recommendations:

The team has recommended these families for emergency assistance of food, NFI and hygiene So, NRC will provide them multipurpose cash and hygiene kits.
