1. Key Facts

2. Context

Description of shock: during month of April 2019 particularly on 15th of April due to Taliban insurgents attack to Police check points and military bases in the area of Dande ghuri and dande shahabuddin of Pol-e khumry district, as a consequence, some number of families have been displaced from their places of origin to other secure areas within Pol-e khumry city centre. These families are currently living primarily with relatives and in rental houses with many unmet humanitarian needs. Team conducted the assessment as of 30th of April and continued until 03-July-2019, during this period totally 1146-HHS have been visited and only 207-families have been found as potentially eligible for ERM assistance.

3. Needs and recommendations

IDENTIFIED NEEDS

Food	80- Households with No food Stocks. 112 Households with stocks for less than a week. 13- Households with stock from 1 to 3 weeks
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	And 2- households with stock up to three months
NFIs	All 43 HHs in need of NFIs (kitchen equipment, fuel, warm clothes, Blankets, water container and Hygiene Supplies)
Financial status	All 207 HHs experienced a drop in income as result of shock, from 4,665 to 869,AFN 92 households out of 207- are already in debt
Shelter	132-households are living in houses,- 74-households living in makeshift shelter and one household in tent. In details; 124-households live in rental houses 64—household live in hosted/sharing with friends or relatives 17-household live in free of charge and 1 household as squatting
WASH	WASH-Hygiene issue: during joint needs assessment it is found that most of the displaced population have low living standard due to low knowledge on health and hygiene, because most of the displaced people cloth seemed filthy and their body skin as well, Some said that they cannot collect water because they don't have water containers: meanwhile (after observation) DACAAR found out that the existing water containers to be dirty with hole and some are don't have lid
Protection	No protection cases identified as vulnerable.

PLANNED RESPONSE

Food	WFP committed to provide food packages to 562 families;
NFIs	NFI is a gap yet,
Shelter	AKAH committed to provide cash for emergency shelter to 50 families;
WASH	DACAAR Proposes the following; <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Implementation of hygiene session to all 207 IDP HHs 2. Distribution of 207 sets of hygiene kits to all 207 IDP HHs 3. Distribution of 9 set of bio sand filter (BSF) as durable solution to 9 IDP families 4. Construction of 5 sets of EBL to those IDP families who are conducting open defecation, 5. Distribution of 8 plastic garbage bags per family to all 207 IDP HHs
