2. Assessment Finding and Recommendation in brief:

DoRR Balkh collected petition of 258HHs displaced to Mazar-e Sharif, Dehdadi & Chimtal as a result of insecurity or ongoing conflict between ANSF and opposition groups. The rapid need assessment reported over (64%) or 35 HHs had arrived from Chimtal, whilst 36% of them had been displaced from Kunduz, Baghlan, Samangan, Sar-I Pul and Faryab.

Joint assessment conducted between 10 – 20 July,2017. Rapid assessment reported 54 out of 258HHs identified as real conflict affected IDP as accepted deserving for humanitarian emergency assistance. The majority of HHs whom had arrived to Mazar-e Sharif with their house commodities and without food stocks. Close to all of displaced families are jobless and have no income to replace their house assets or food stocks. HHs had borrowed money after displacement to pay for rent or transportation. As reported, 24% of HHs have debt over 8.000-AFA, around 30% between 2.000 to 8.000-AFA, close to 6% of them debt less than 2.000. Households reported either living with host families or in rented accommodation with poor facility.

Recommendation:

As families displaced immediately, all of them lifted their belongings behind. Market assessment reported functioning markets, hence provision of cash or in-kind assistance recommended for all.

3. Sectorial Issues:

A) Food Security, Nutrition and Livelihood:

As result of assessment, 44HHs (81%) reported having no food stocks, though the remaining have food stock which last less than a week. there are 11-breastfeeding and 1-pregnant woman whom cannot get enough nutrition, there is increased risk that families will face challenges having access to food.

Though, the highest income reported by respondents before the displacement was 8.000 AFA, households reported have no income after displacement.

Recommendation:

Provide emergency food basket or cash assistance to cover their food needs.

B) NFIs

All households reported loss of kitchen, WASH, hygiene, shelter items including blankets, and water containers

Recommendation:

NFIs will provide by Save the children organization, thus no cash assistance will be provided to cover NFIs

C) Shelter:

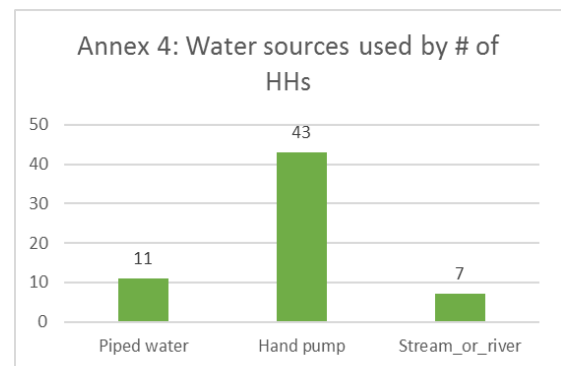
- 28 HHs reported living with host families, whilst 18 households reported living in rented accommodation with average rent of over 1.100-AFA/month

Recommendation:

All HHs assessed lived in rented accommodation or with host families. Emergency shelter kits are not required.

D) WASH:

- 43HHs reported accessing hand pumps water.
- 7HHs reported accessing water through stream or river
- 11 HHs also reported access through pipe water.
- The average distance of water source is 8.3 minutes by foot,
- Men and women have access to water
- 47HHs have access to family pit latrine.
- 7HHs use open defecation.



Recommendation:

Provide households with hygiene kits and conduct hygiene promotion sessions, also to be build emergency latrine & bath based on needs of households.

E) Protection

Recommendation:

There are no families with more than one vulnerability to meet IPA criteria to trigger an IPA assessment.

F) Health:

Mazar city has functioning health facilities, individuals can safely access.

Recommendation:

Families in need of additional medical care or medication. Thus, probably they will need to buy medicine. Distribution of cash for medication recommended.
