Family Tracing and Reunification update	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Save the Children will hold a meeting tomorrow, 28 January, to review 2015 and strategize for 2016. They will focus on resolving FTR programming gaps in the New Year. • The FTR TWG meeting will be held 5 February. An invitation will be sent out by the TWG. • The performance report for 2015 is not ready for dissemination yet. Should be ready before the next meeting. • Save the Children recommended watching a TV production from Unreported World titled Frontline Family Reunions. Monitoring and Reporting Mechanism / Children Associated with Armed Forces and Armed Groups updates	<p><u>CAAFAG</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The January 21 TWG meeting discussed the new CAAFAG results framework. • The SPLA-IO signed an Action Plan with the UN Country Task Force on Monitoring and Reporting to end and prevent recruitment and use of children in armed conflict. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The NDDRC will be more involved in the next steps of the Action Plan going forward. ○ The Action Plan will be shared more widely soon, but some issues and official appointments are still being negotiated. • A mop up exercise will take place in GPAA, next month, February. There are still children in the Cobra Faction and CAAFAG partners, i.e. NDDRC and UNICEF, are looking for a way to get them out. • An SOP for CAAFAG partners is being crafted and will include the existing SOP for ICCs. • Next CAAFAG meeting will be held 4 February. 		
Psychosocial Support WG	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Members invited to PSS meeting on Thursday 28 January 2016 at 10 a.m. • PSS categories in 5W under review, to clearly capture ongoing interventions in South Sudan. • Last meeting held in December, with report / presentation capturing overview of achievements and lessons learned. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ 95% of sub-cluster target reached in 2015. ○ 70% of beneficiaries reached through community based PSS, from 5% at the beginning of 2015. ○ Schools are the main location for CBPSS, with activities taking place in the break times and after school hours. There is still a need to reach out to other community structures.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Transition of CFS from stand-alone into community based CFS. ○ There is increased focus on strengthening quality of PSS activities. ○ Data collection and reporting is important and need to be improved. ○ Debate about percentages of how many children we reach with PSS was held. Further discussion can take place during the PSS TWG meetings. <p><u>Discussion</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Reporting of PSS achievements: debate over reaching traumatised children outside PoCs, and on how PSSWG intends to meet the gaps. ● There was a request for mental health data that can guide and support PSSWG with planning. 		
Field updates	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● WVI implementing in Western Equatoria (Yambio / Ezo refugee camps response) in partnership with UNHCR. Also implementing in Wau-Shilluk, Malakal, and Kodok. Interventions include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Child reunification centres (PSS and FTR) ○ PSS outreach activities for children. ● SCA: People have fled Yambio town; 3-day assessment being carried out starting Wednesday 27 Jan, and SCA will share findings. SCA on ground in Yambio (SCA, UNHCR, WVI) ● There is a planned Mingkaman assessment, targeting the newly displaced population. ● IRNA planned for Lankien; SCI will share documentation on the same. ● GREDO are working on case transfers between Vertet and Pibor in GPAA. ● NP: CPWG for Juba PoCs meeting is held every fortnight on Tuesdays at 10 a.m.: partners are encouraged to participate. The CPWG is currently collecting data on Child Protection issues to support planning for 2016. ● NP requesting for all Child Protection actors in the PoCs to get in touch. ● MAYA: Access still a challenge in Mundri. The situation has calmed down, and returns are expected. There is need to assess and identify Child Protection needs. ● Cases of abductions were reported in Duk and Twic East.
