Objective: Coordination meeting with CCCM/Shelter/NFI sector partners working in Dikwa to strengthen LGA level coordination to strengthen the response on sites, identification of responsible agencies CCCM/Shelter/NFI and discussions on the site plan for the newly identified IDP settlement.

	<p><i>Annex 1_DIKWA needs, gaps, interventions and response_PPT</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • IDP camps: 15,251 households / 79,079 IDPs. Eight IDP camps; 5 collective centers (congested), 3 open lots. • Host Community: est. 7,481 HH ,37,618 individuals . • Newly arrived populations: +2,500 3rd week of February. • New arrivals on a daily basis: estimate 200/300 per day coming into town following the liberation of villages by the army. • Shelter needs (est): IDP sites (in makeshift or sharing space): 5,900 households. • IDP in HC: est. 2,200 households (makeshift and/or no shelter). • In the past, lack of land available to build emergency shelters and high level of congestion in the collective centres needing to be rehabilitated. • Large portion of the land is flood prone and require in-depth topographic analysis and drainage assessment. • Response (reported on the 4W matrix): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Shelter: UNHCR 100 ES built, 500 SK planned. IOM planned: 1,000 ES. ICRC 274 TS (under completion together with the latrines, constructed in the stadium, to be completed by mid-March). PINE shelters completed. - CCCM: NCRS Focal point on site, IOM deployment of SF roving team (3 staff) for site facilitation. - NFI: ICRC 14,947 HH kit, UNHCR 5,000. • Increased sanitation risks reported by WHO & WASH: Three health facilities providing services in Sangaya Kilagori, Shehu camp and the MCH. WASH situation in Mohd Kyari, Shehu Sanda and 20 housing unit is fair with adequate latrines facilities. Sangaya camp need to scale up the WASH support / emptying the latrines to avoid risk of contamination. Need to ensure more health outreach for sites no having access to health clinics (20 housing unit & Bulabulin community). • CCCM Gap analysis: Baseline tool used to refine the gaps to inform the prioritisation of the response highlight a high scoring of 	<p>Shelter/NFI &CCCM sector</p>

	needs in the camps. Gap analysis to be refined as sectors are conducting interventions & need assessments.	
Information sharing of interventions	<p><i>Annex 1_DIKWA needs, gaps, interventions and response_PPT</i> _Updated Table of interventions reported during the meeting.</p> <p>ACTION: CCCM/Shelter/NFI partners to update the information as plans gets confirmed.</p> <p>ACTION: Sector to share the table to OCHA and LGA Desk Officer as a baseline information.</p>	Partners
New IDP site and Site plan	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • New arrivals of population and request received by IOM from NEMA/LGA authorities to provide a shelter response in Dikwa. • Site plan (annex 2) developed for the installation of emergency shelters as per the land identified by the LGA chairman. The proposed site can accommodate for 1,000 families and there is a need to advocate and secure for more land. In view of the new arrivals and increase of populations, it was recommended to build emergency shelters to host more families. Discussions however took place on the capacity to look at the installation of Bakasi type of shelters (Transitional). Reinforced shelters are more costly and provide less space per family but can be transitional for an urban environment and require less maintenance in the longer-term. Further discussions to be taken on the type of shelter, based on needs and capacities of implementation. • The land is prone to flood and there is a need to conduct topographic studies on site before installing shelters. • For this site plan, 1,000 shelters could be constructed by IOM plus 20 Blocks of Latrines and 10 Shower blocks and there is still space for additional structures. FHI360: Upgrading of 2 water points in Shehu Sanda and Sangaya camps through UNICEF and RUWASA. FHII proposed to add water supply points plus full hygiene packages to complement the IOM WASH interventions in the IDP site. • Mercy Cops has a provision of shelters for 800 families (400 TS or ES type), either in host or to extend the site. Mercy Cops indicated capacity to provide environmental health support and building of drainages and also to plan for NFI distribution. • ICRC is looking at complementing interventions (Shelter & Wash), should the land be secured and the topographical studies made for the drainage ahead of any installation. <p>ACTION: Bilateral meeting between IOM and FHI to discuss plans for wash facilities / drainage / site plan, once the type of shelter is confirmed.</p> <p>ACTION: Sector to discuss with shelter partners regarding the type of shelter intervention in Dikwa and land extension (Reinforced shelter or emergency shelter construction based on capacities, rate of implementation, land extension).</p> <p>ACTION: Health sector to meet to discuss plan on adding health facilities.</p> <p>ACTION: FHI360 to confirm the possibility to conduct topographical studies.</p> <p>ACTION: NEMA to provide contact details of the LGA desk officer.</p> <p>ACTION: NEMA to confirm provision of NFI for new arrivals.</p>	MERCY COPS / ICRC / NEMA / IOM / FHI360
