

South Sudan: Family Tracing and Reunification: Status of Reunification by County (May 2017)

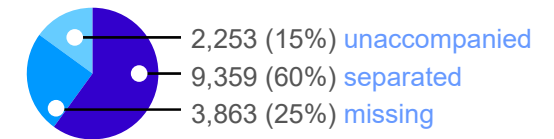

South Sudan

Since onset of the South Sudan crisis in December 2013, there have been 15,475 recorded cases of unaccompanied, separated and missing children across 42 counties. Out of these, 4,945 (43%) of the 11,612 unaccompanied and separated children have been reunified with their families (as at 21 May 2017). Since renewed conflict in July 2016, the caseload has increased by a significant 18% from 13,090* to 15,475 girls and boys in May 2017.

Total caseload of **15,475 girls and boys** out of whom **11,612** are unaccompanied & separated children

Of the 15,475 girls and boys:



43 out of every 100

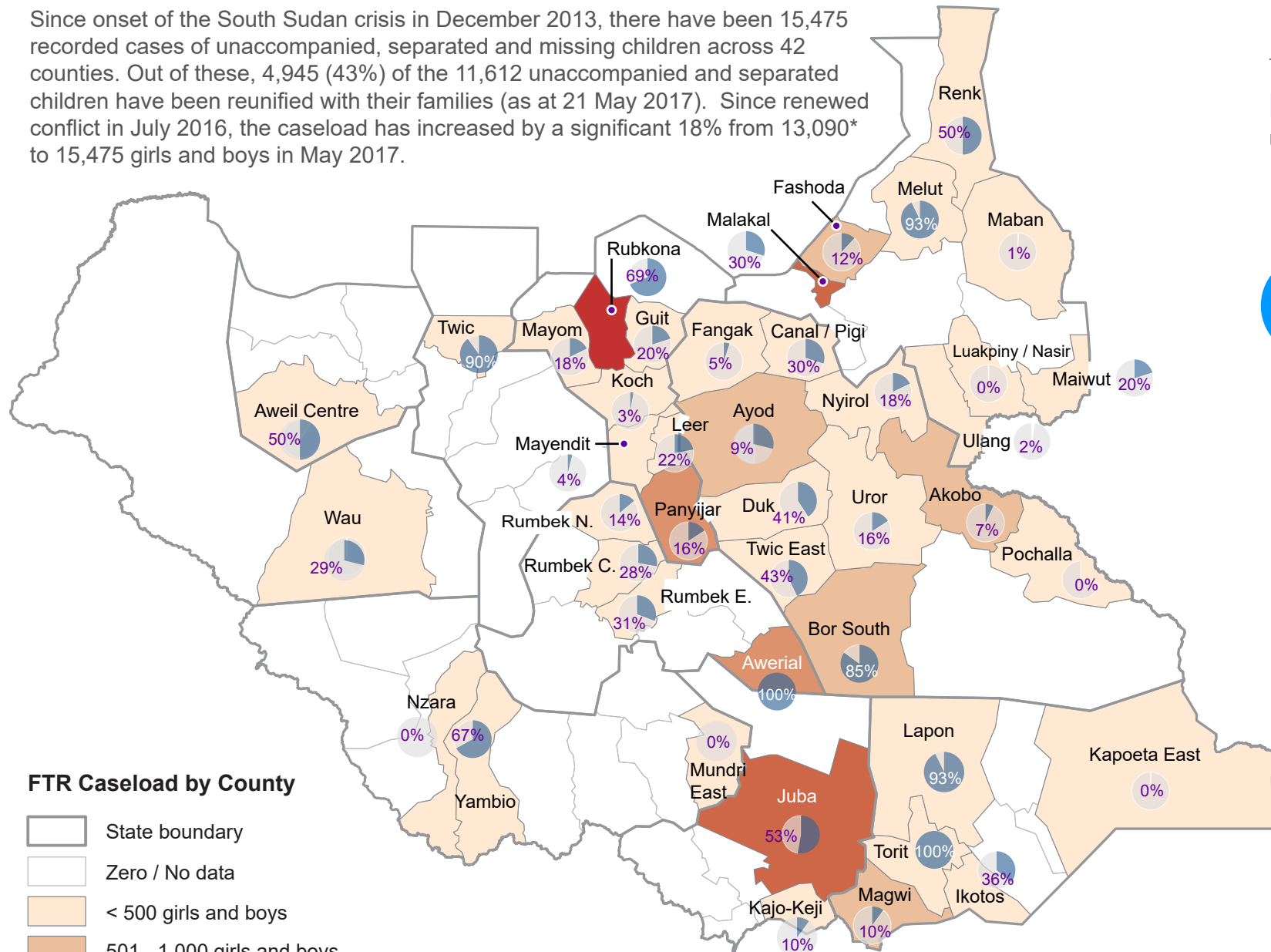
unaccompanied and separated children **have been reunified** with their families since onset of the crisis in December 2013



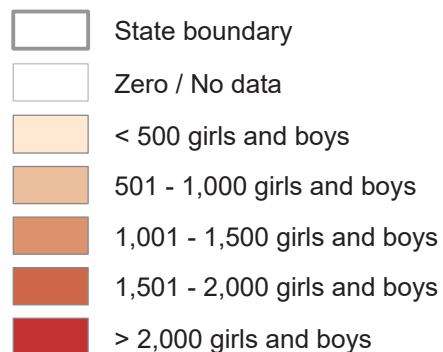
7 out of every 10 (70%) of unaccompanied children have received at least one follow up
