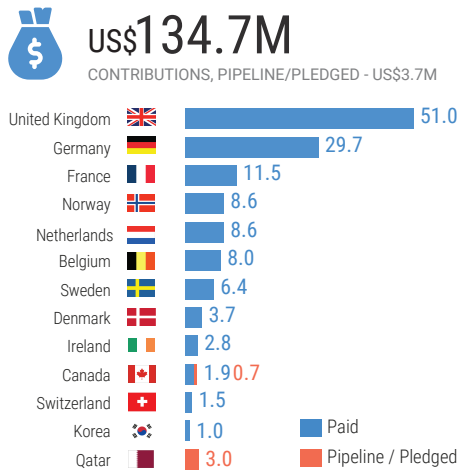


Syria Cross-Border Humanitarian Fund has allocated a record \$116.9 million through two standard and four reserve allocations in 2019. Throughout the year, the rapidly deteriorating situation in northwest Syria has called for multiple reserve allocations to support a swift and timely response. A large number of projects were reprogrammed to respond to the changing context; the largest number of revisions was due to many locations becoming inaccessible or expanding critical services to target additional needs in the project areas. For the first time, a \$10 million reserve allocation was launched targeting northeast Syria to address the most urgent needs and gaps in complementarity with other funding streams.

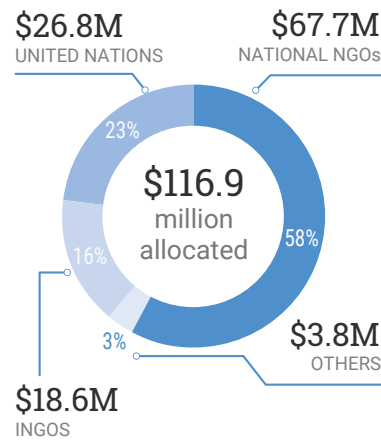

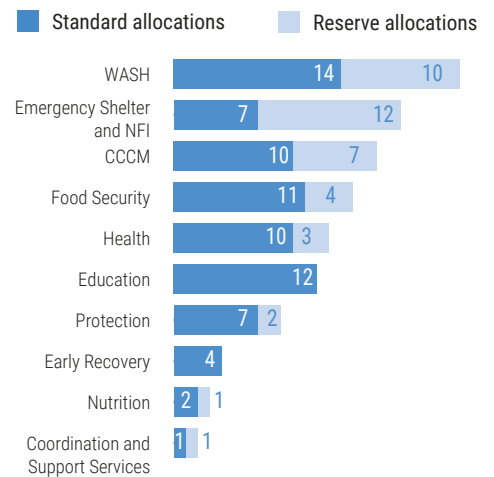

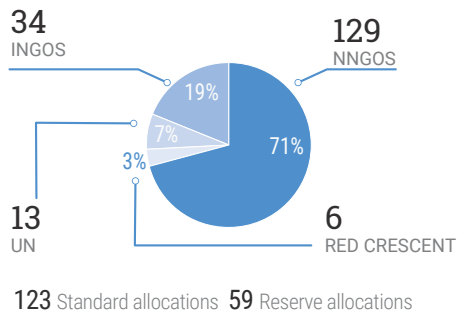
### Allocations by type of partner



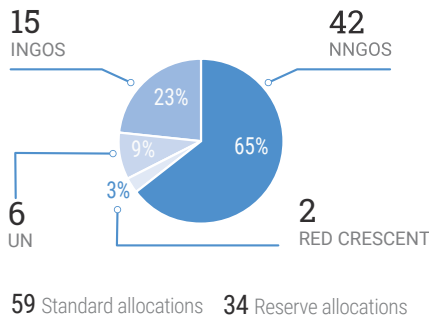
### Allocations by cluster



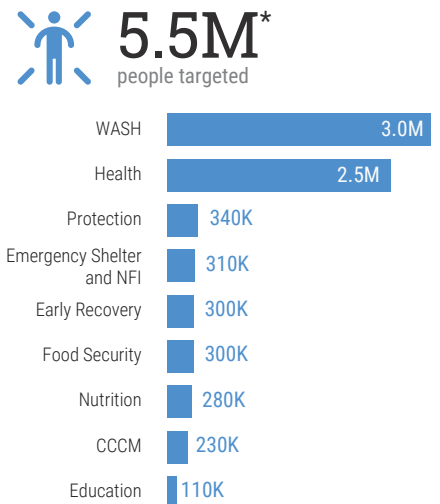
### 182 projects funded by type of partner



### 65 partners funded by type



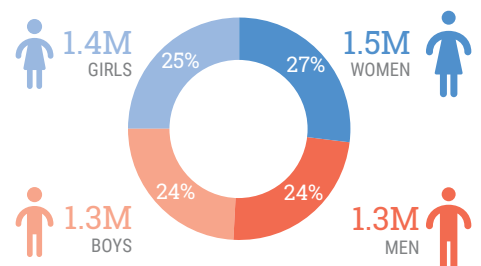
### People targeted by cluster
