Updates: COVID-19, as of March 28th 2021

Situation overview:

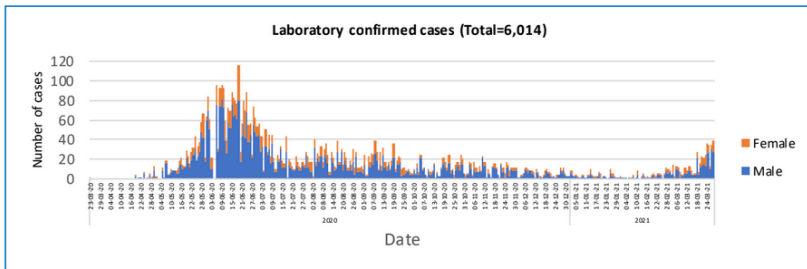
From 22-28 March 2021

- 209 new COVID-19 positive cases were reported in Cox’s Bazar:
 - 2 new cases among FDMN/ Rohingya refugees
 - 203 from the host community
- 60 Rohingya refugees are in-home quarantine in the camps
- 692 persons from HC are currently in-home quarantine in Cox’s Bazar

COVID-19 update of Laboratory Confirmed Cases among Host Population



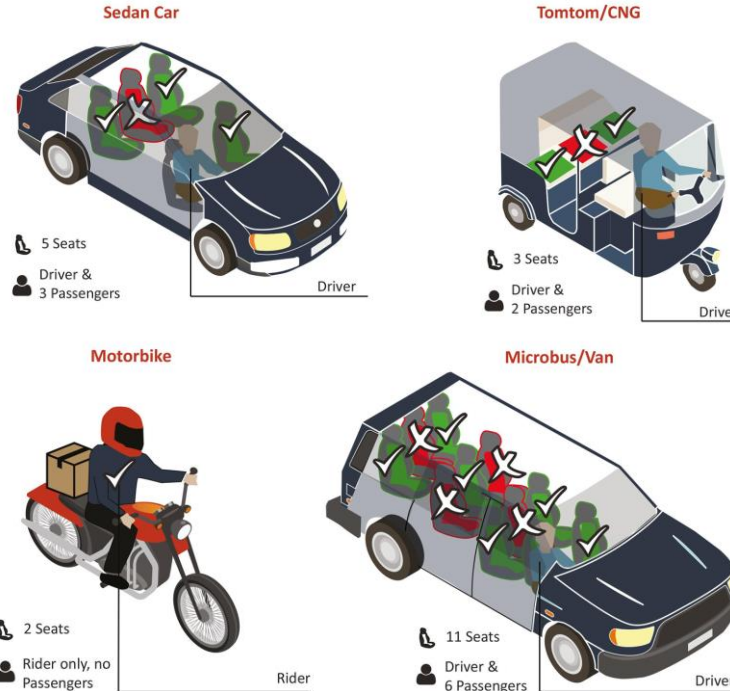

Updates: RRRC directives

- We are still following the 24 August 2020 directive on implementation of critical services :
 - Strengthening of distribution of essential NFIs across all camps, including LPG refills assistance. Provision of assistance to households with shelters in poor condition and NFI distribution for older persons and those in quarantine centres.
 - Emergency shelter response in all camps due to damages caused by monsoon.
- Under the directive from April 5th 2021: Facilities, services and activities to be temporarily closed:
 - Tie down kit distribution and temporary shelter assistance (Apart from emergency services, to be determined by concerned CiCs); **(only till April 11th)**

Updates COVID-19 prevention measures

- Vehicles Access Permission is needed to get to camps
- Physical distancing in vehicles



Updates: COVID-19 prevention measures

- April 2nd directive:
- This also should include physical distancing measures, use of personal protective equipment (wearing masks), hand washing and temperature screening at entry points.
- In response to the recent updated COVID-19 situation, this office would like to request all of you to implement the activities in the camps in line with COVID-19 mitigation
- The presence of staff of all organizations should be reduced by 50% measures recommended by the Government of Bangladesh.
- The emergency response to fire incident in camp 8W, 8E, 9 should be excluded from "50% staffing" policy.

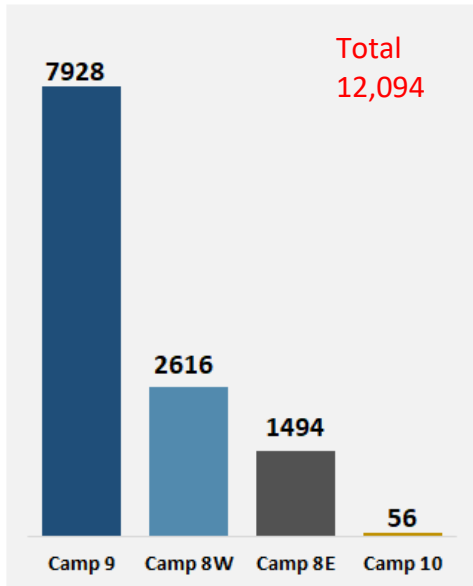

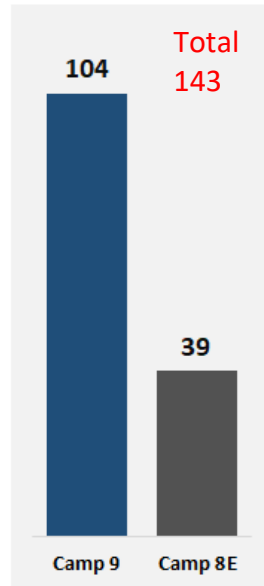

General updates on the fire response as of April 7th

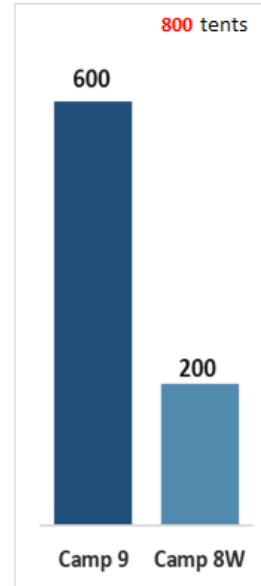
- In total **12,237** shelter kits have been distributed to the HHs affected by fire in camps 8W, 8E and 9.
- 8,664 Kitchen sets along with 4 masks have been distributed to affected Rohingya Refugees households in Camp 9 & 8W.



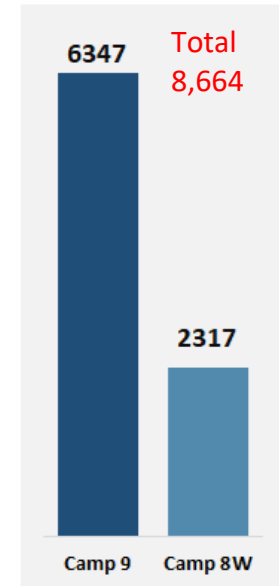
Emergency Shelter/NFI Kits Distribution for Rohingya Refugees

General updates on the fire response as of April 7th

- LPG cylinder with stove distribution is ongoing, 5,360 HHs received LPG Cylinder and Stove in Camp 9.
- IOM in coordination with WFP and UNHCR is distributing SCOPE cards to ensure proper HHs identification, 8,664 scope cards were distributed to affected Rohingya Refugees households in Camp 9 & 8W.
- IOM will provide second phase of the shelter support to 142 affected Host Community Households living inside the camp boundaries, through the cash assistance. Assessment is ongoing.



General updates on the fire response

SECOND phase of the Shelter assistance

RRRC office is expected to **provide the approved template of shelter model to be used in conjunction with different block layouts being designed by the site planning teams.** This planning process is essential to promote a process of reconstruction based on the Build Back Safer objectives of sustainability, equity, and increased safety.

Reality in the camps: Most of the refugees rebuilt their shelters with their own means

Based on the directive from 31 March 2021, only few partners will be able to provide the assistance to the camps affected by fire. Additional assistance will be directed to other camps in need of shelter reinforcement.

CiCs are informed about this directive

Preparedness	<p>At agency level</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ensure pre-positioning of Emergency Shelter/NFI Kits at defined locations- coordinate with UNHCR and IOM respectively to the AoR • Distribute Tie Down Kits and messaging (Preparedness support) to households • Ensure all your community facilities are securely tied down (Prepare your shelter for the bad weather) • Whenever possible support other sectors with strengthening community facilities • Form distribution teams and orient them- coordinate with UNHCR and IOM respectively to the AoR • Prepare transportation plan for materials (including portering) in coordination with Logistics Sector • Attend emergency preparedness meetings

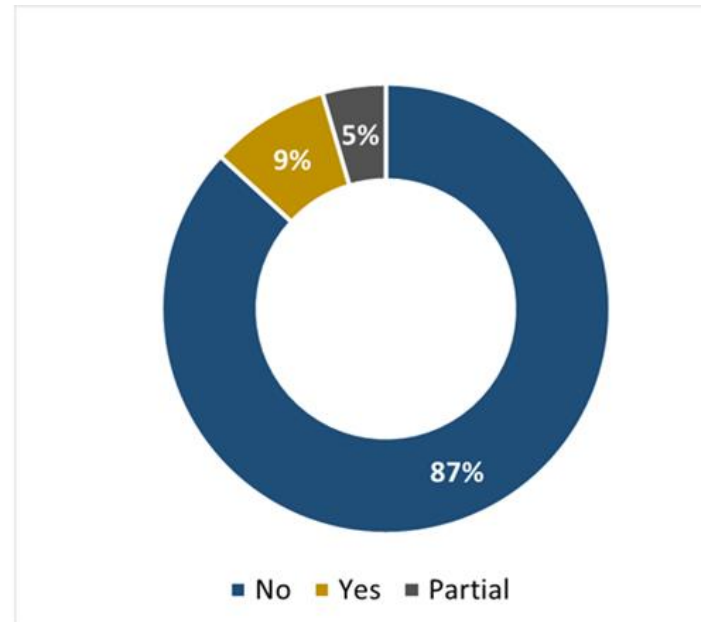

	At sector level <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Share communication with partners (from ISCG) • Verify locations and numbers of Emergency Shelter/NFI Kits and share information • Attend emergency preparedness meetings, if needed.
