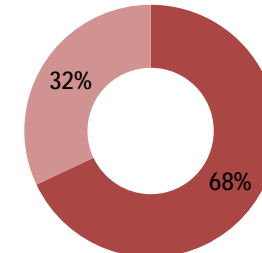

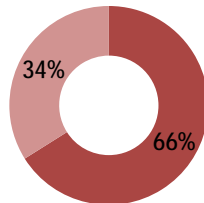
Guinea (8.9m)



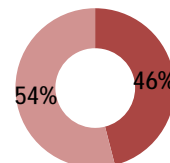

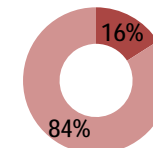

Guinea	This revised Emergency Appeal (increased from 2,6 million CHF in September) enables the IFRC to support the Red Cross Society of Guinea to respond to the escalating EVD outbreak by delivering assistance and support to some 11.1m people , with a focus on information and communication, education, awareness raising, and social mobilization, surveillance, case identification and contact management, case management (including management of dead bodies), psychosocial support, and regional preparedness and response. With the Emergency Response Unit (ERU) component valued at some CHF 180,000, the total amount sought amounts to CHF 8.93m. The revised plan reflects an increased number of people to be reached, a scale-up of activities and the number of volunteers, and an enlarged geographic scope (see map). Liberia	This revised Emergency Appeal (increased from 1.8 million CHF in September) enables the IFRC to support the Liberian National Red Cross Society (LNRCS) to respond to the escalating EVD outbreak by delivering assistance and support to some 4.5m people , with a focus on information and communication, education, awareness raising, and social mobilization, surveillance, case identification and contact management, case management (including management of dead bodies), psychosocial support, and regional collaboration. With the Emergency Response Unit (ERU) component valued at some CHF 96,000, the total amount sought amounts to CHF 8.5m. The revised plan reflects an extended timeframe, an increase in activities and the number of volunteers (including dead body management), and an enlarged geographic scope (from 5 to 15 counties). Nigeria	This Emergency Appeal for a total of CHF 1,619,444 enables the IFRC to support the Nigeria Red Cross Society to deliver assistance and support to some 5,000,000 people with a focus on information and communication, education, awareness raising, social mobilization, surveillance, case identification and contact tracing and psychosocial support. Sierra Leone	Revised emergency appeal No. 3 from CHF 12,9 m to 41,1 m – October 24 This revised Emergency Appeal seeks a total of CHF 12,855,909 (increased from CHF 1,366,156 in September) to enable the IFRC to support the Sierra Leone Red Cross Society (SLRCS) to respond to the worsening EVD outbreak through delivering assistance and support to some 6,348,350 people , with a focus on information and communication, education, awareness raising, and social mobilization, surveillance, case identification and contact management, case management (including management of dead bodies), psychosocial support, and regional preparedness and response. The revised appeal also covers establishment of an Ebola treatment centre in Kenema district through the deployment of an Emergency Response Unit (ERU). The revised plan reflects an increase in activities (including dead body management) and geographic scope.	Ebola treatment centre in Kenema	41,165,649	16,054,603.11	61%
Senegal	This Emergency Appeal (launched on September 29) for a total of CHF 1.380,692 enables the IFRC to support the Senegalese Red Cross Society (SRC) to respond to the Ebola Virus Disease (EVD) outbreak by delivering assistance and support to 2.2m people, with a focus on information and communication, education, awareness raising, and social mobilization, surveillance, case identification and contact management, case management (including management of dead bodies), psychosocial support, and regional collaboration. While the outbreak in Senegal is currently considered contained, risk analyses define Senegal as a high-risk country and continued strengthening of response capacity and preparedness is vital for an early and effective response to potential new cases. Coordination & Preparedness	The Regional Coordination and Preparedness Emergency Appeal is launched by the IFRC to supplement and to support the current country-level Ebola Virus Disease (EVD) Emergency Appeals and preparedness operations supported by the Disaster Relief Emergency Fund (DREF). The aim of this appeal is to strengthen and scale up operations support, coordination, communication, capacity building and preparedness for at risk countries in the region and to prepare for the potential spread of Ebola outbreak to other countries in Africa and beyond.
