

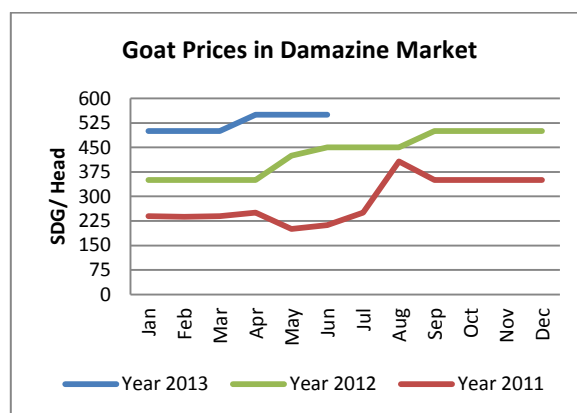
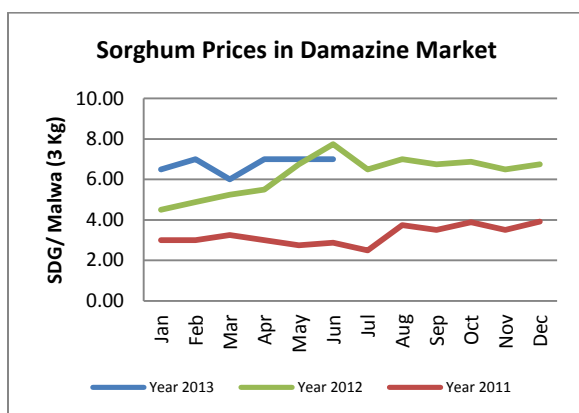


Overall summary

- Following the normal trend during lean season, cereal prices are on the rise in some markets while the good harvest of the previous season is providing a buffer against price increase in other markets.
- Prior to the month of *Ramadan*, increase demand for livestock is pushing up goat prices in many markets, especially when June prices are compared to prices of the same time last year.
- In all monitored markets, ground nut prices in June are below the same time last year prices, thus confirming previous expectations on an exceptionally good ground nut harvest in the 2012/ 13 season.

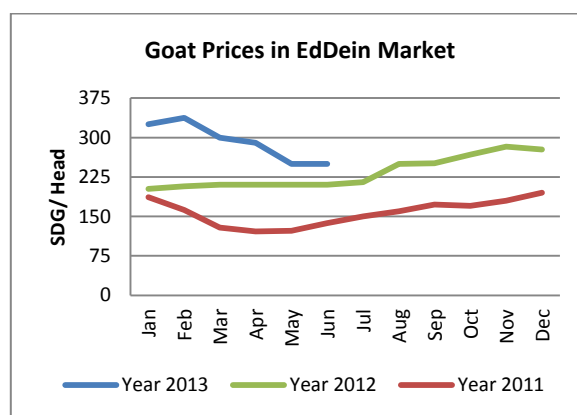
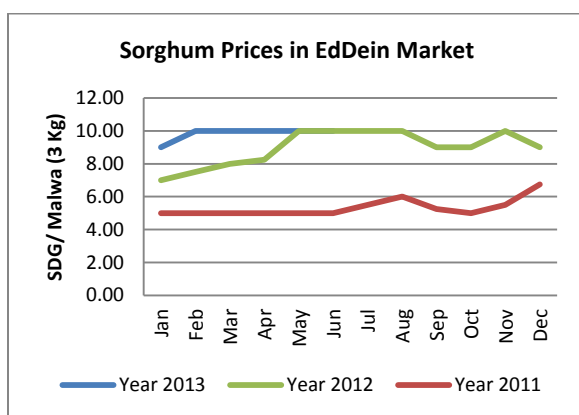
Blue Nile State (Damazine market)

- Stable Sorghum prices in June compared to May prices but 10% below the same time last year prices.
- Stable goat prices in June compared to May prices but 22% above the same time last year prices.
- Stable ground nut prices in June compared to May prices but 10% below the same time last year prices.



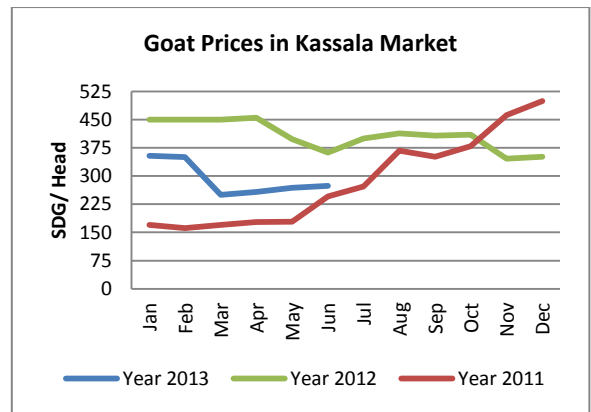
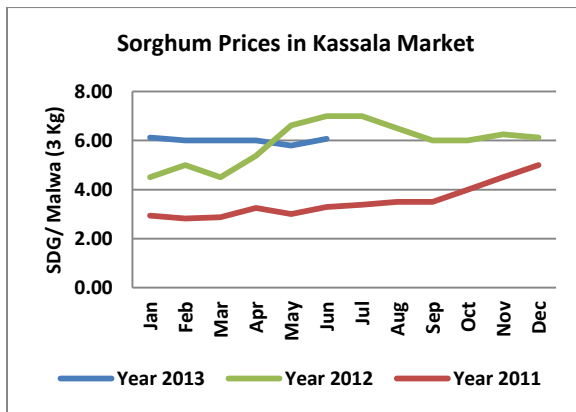
East Darfur State (Ed Dein market)

- Stable sorghum prices in June compared to both May and the same time last year prices.
- Stable goat prices in June compared to May prices but 19% above the same time last year prices.
- Ground nut prices in June are 25% above May prices due to high demand for ground nut seeds in this region (one of the main surplus regions in Darfur). However, June prices are 20% below the same time last year prices.



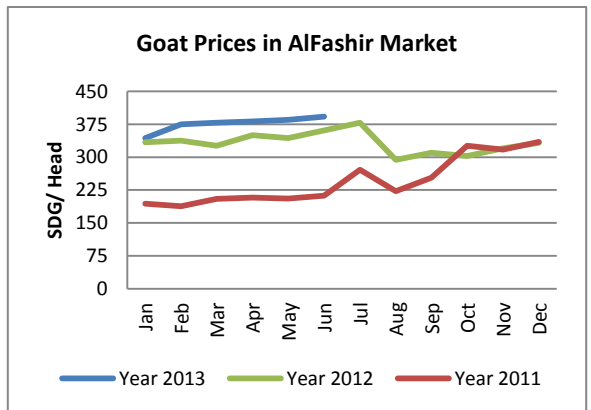
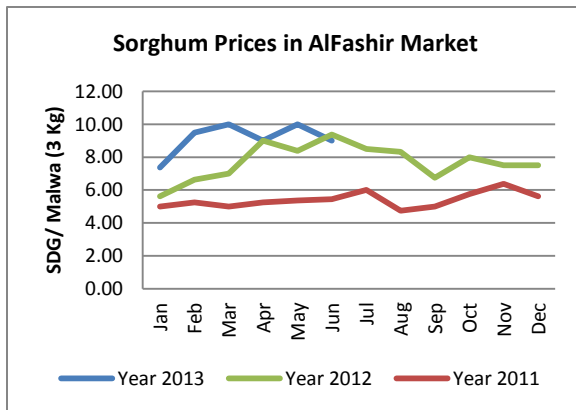
Kassala State (Kassala market)

- Sorghum prices in June are 5% above May prices but 13% below the same time last year prices.
- Goat prices in June are 2% above May prices but 24% below the same time last year prices.



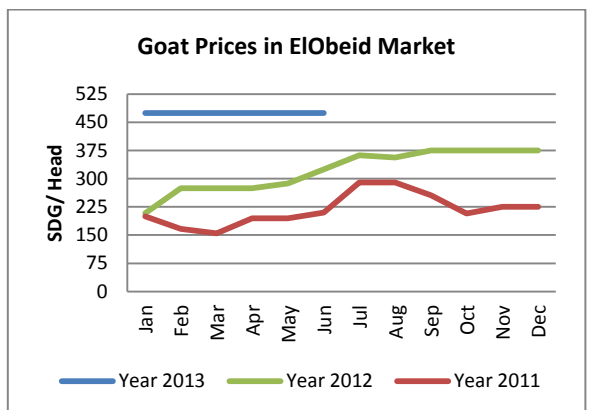
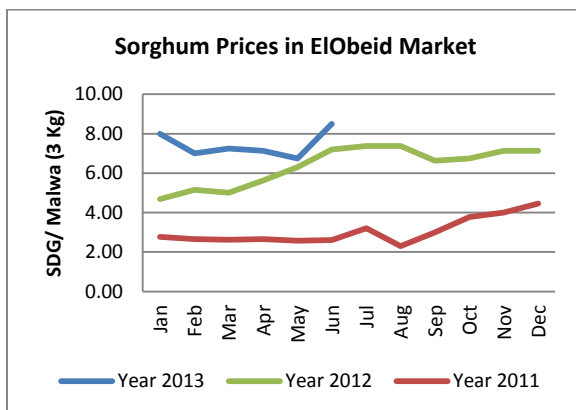
North Darfur State (AlFashir market)

- Sorghum prices in June are 10% below May prices and 4% below the same time last year prices. Release of sorghum by the government besides restrictions on grain movement outside the state are believed to be the main reasons for the decline.
- Goat prices in June are 2% above May prices and 9% above the same time last year prices.
- Stable ground nut prices in June compared to May prices but 43% below the same time last year prices..



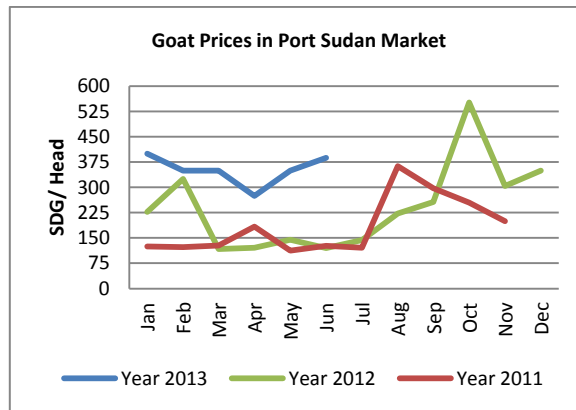
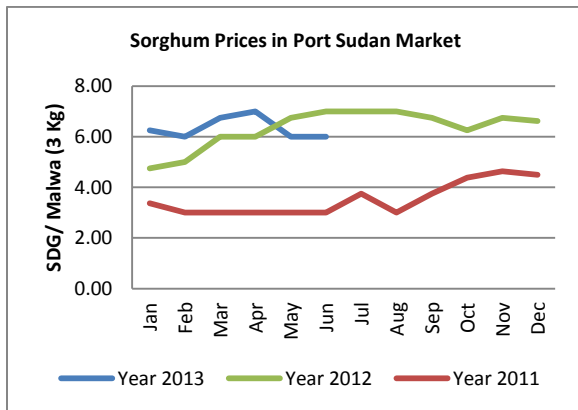
North Kordofan State (EIObeid market)

- Sorghum prices in June are 26% above May prices and 18% above the same time last year prices. Drops in sorghum supply from South Kordofan (insecurity) and White Nile (separation of south) are accompanied by high demand for feeding export livestock.
- Stable goat prices in June compared to May prices but 46% above the same time last year prices.
- Stable ground nut prices in June compared to May prices but 23% below the same time last year prices



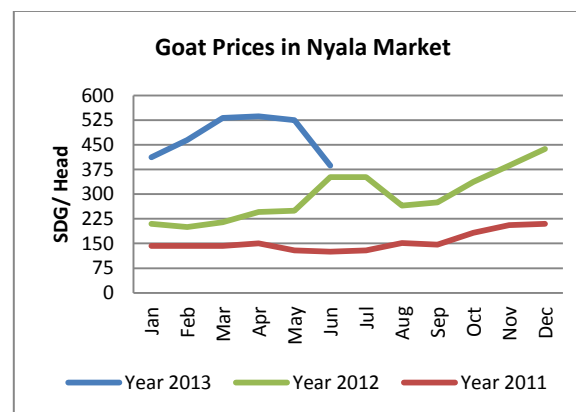
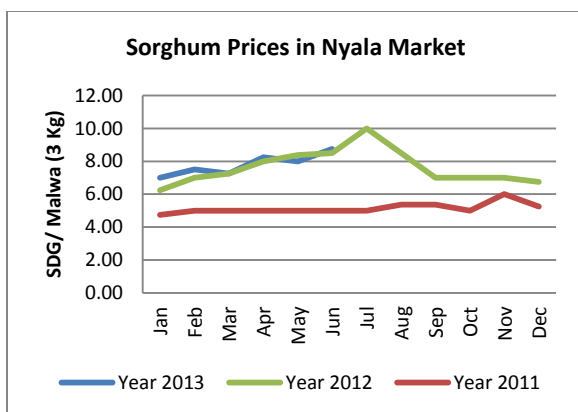
Red Sea State (Port Sudan market)

- Stable Sorghum prices in June compared to May prices but 14% below the same time last year prices.
- Goat prices in June are 11% above May prices and 223% above the same time last year prices. Drop in livestock supply on local markets is the main reason for the prevalence of high prices.



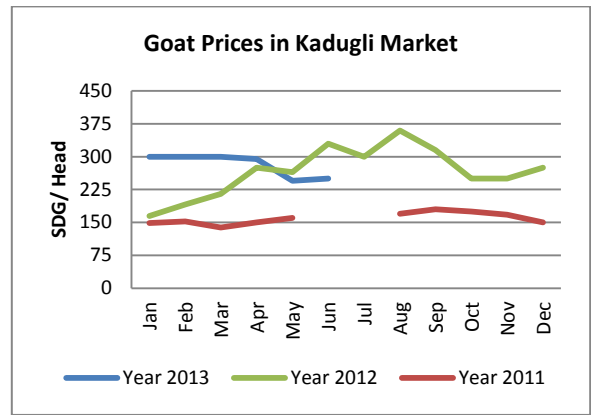
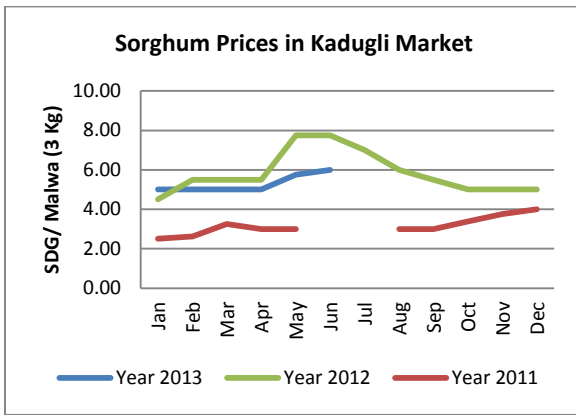
South Darfur State (Nyala market)

- Sorghum prices in June are 9% above May prices and 3% above the same time last year prices.
- Goat prices in June are 26% below May prices but 9% above the same time last year prices. While goat prices are going down due to the seasonal movement of the livestock owners to home areas during the rainy season, distress animal sale by the IDPs, especially the new arrivals who moved with their animals to the Nyala camps, has further pushed down June prices to a relatively low level compared to May prices.
- Ground nut prices in June are 5% below May prices and 32% below the same time last year prices.



South Kordofan State (Kadugli market)

- Sorghum prices in June are 4% above May prices but 23% below the same time last year prices.
- Goat prices in June are 2% above May prices but 24% below the same time last year prices.
- Stable ground nut prices in June compared to May prices but 13% below the same time last year prices.



West Darfur State (ElGeneina market)

- Sorghum prices in June are 7% below both May and the same time last year prices.
- Goat prices in June are 7% above May prices and 10% above the same time last year prices.
- Ground nut prices in June are 19% below May prices and 36% below the same time last year prices due to supply increase on this market with the onset of the rainy season.
