Highlights

- Twenty-three (23) new cases reported from 29th July to 31st July, 2019 from the 3 LGAs (Yola North, Yola South and Girei) bringing total case count to 457.
- No new death reported within the reporting period (CFR=0.87 %).
- No new ward affected. Total number of wards which reported at least one suspected case still stands at 17.
- Song LGA has not reported a new case in 3 weeks

Epidemiological Summary

The total number of cases reported as at 31st July, 2019 stands at 457, with 4 deaths (CFR=0.87 %). Yola North has 276 cases with 2 deaths (CFR= 0.72 %); Girei has 141 cases with 1 death (CFR= 0.71 %) Yola South has 39 cases with 1 death (CFR= 2.56 %) and Song has 1 case with 0 death (CFR= 0 %). So far, 149 samples yielded growth suggestive of *Vibrio cholerae* on culture and results of 7 isolates from the reference laboratory revealed 01 serotype.

Adamawa State - Nigeria: Number of Suspected Cholera Cases Reported Between 15th May to 30th July, 2019

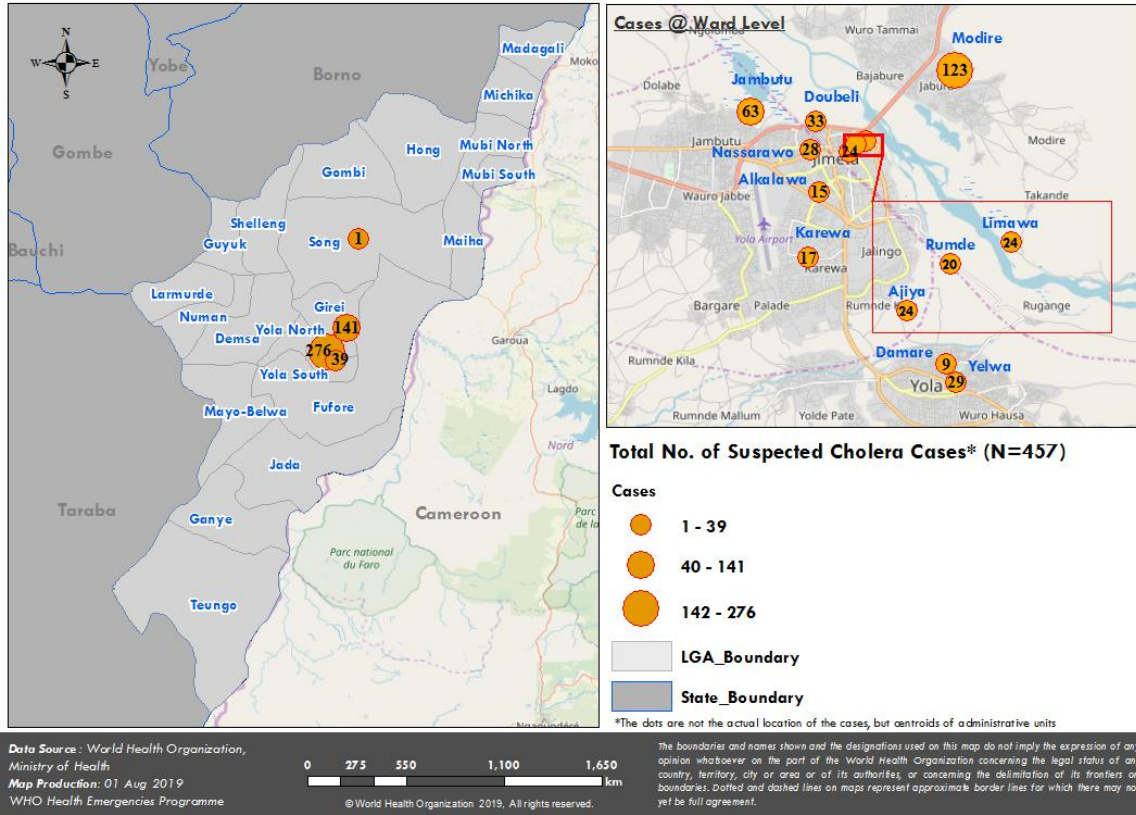


Figure 1: Map of Adamawa State showing cases of suspected Cholera in the affected Wards of the four Local Government Areas

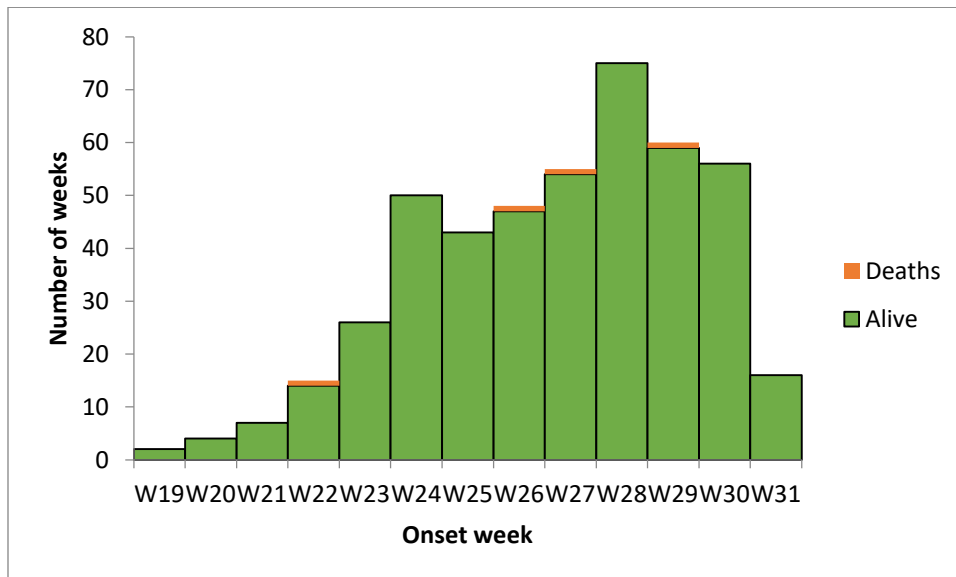


Figure 2: Weekly Epi-curve of suspected cholera cases in Adamawa State (Weeks 19-31)

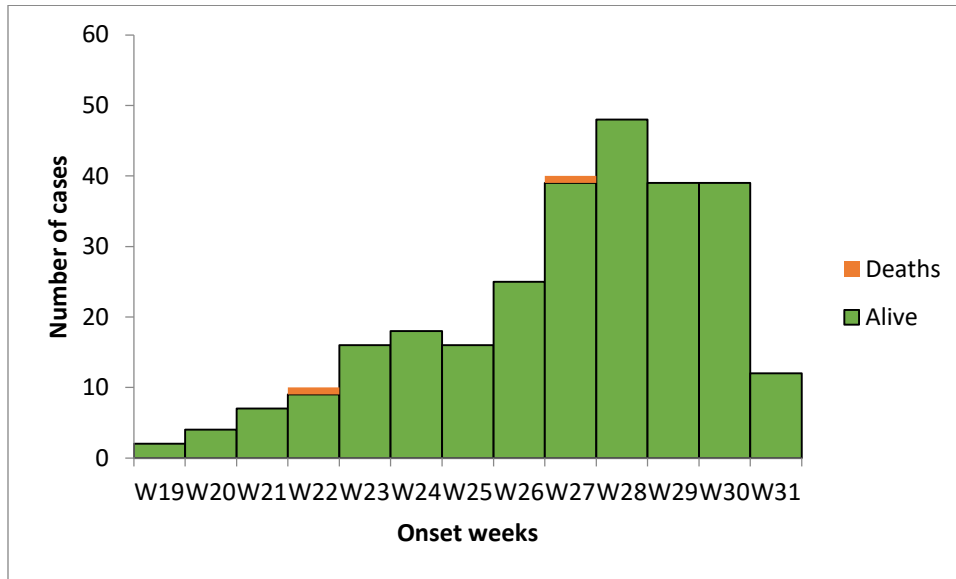


Figure 3: Weekly Epi-curve of suspected cholera cases in Yola North, Adamawa State (weeks 19-31)

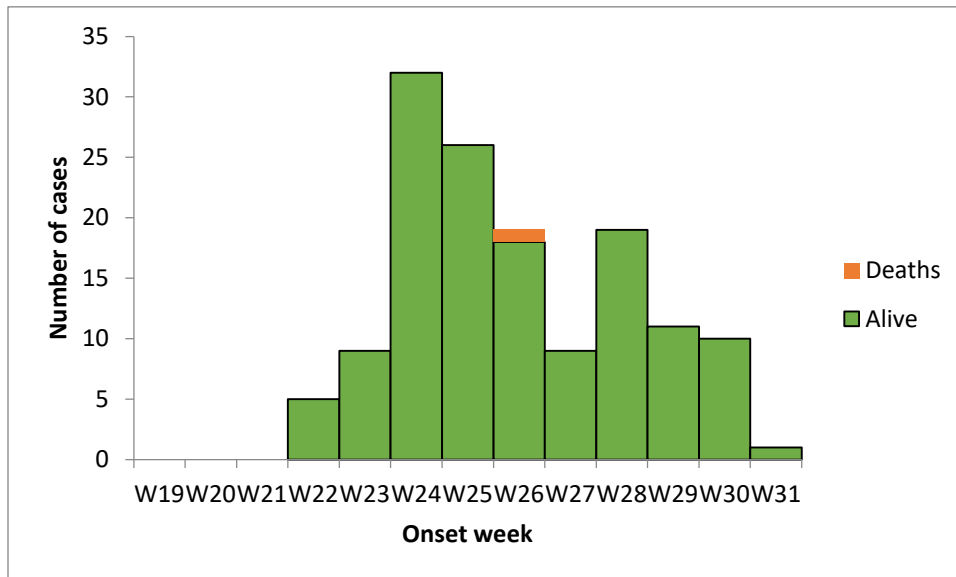


Figure 4: Weekly Epi-curve of suspected cholera cases in Girei, Adamawa State (weeks 19-31)

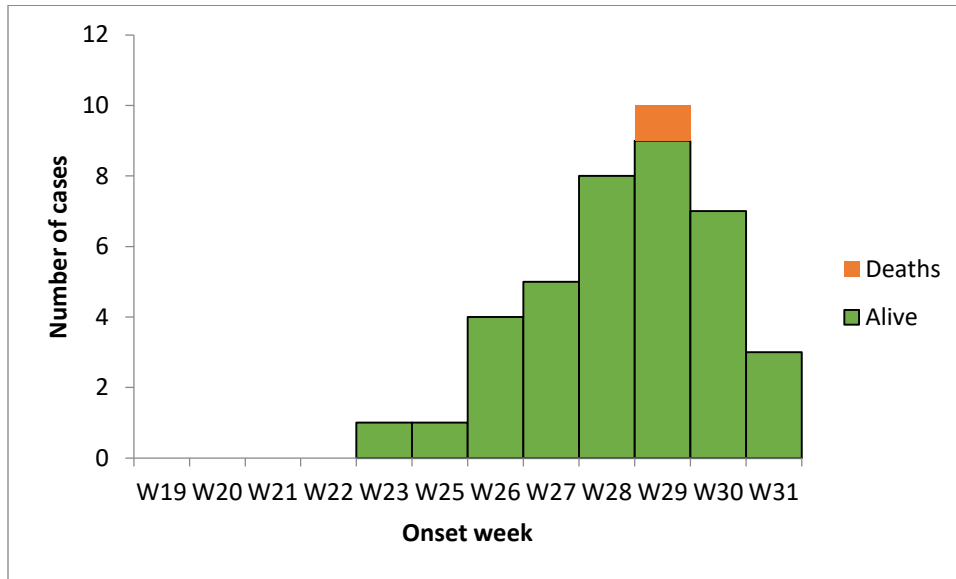


Figure 5: Weekly Epi-curve of suspected cholera cases in Yola South, Adamawa State (weeks 19-31)

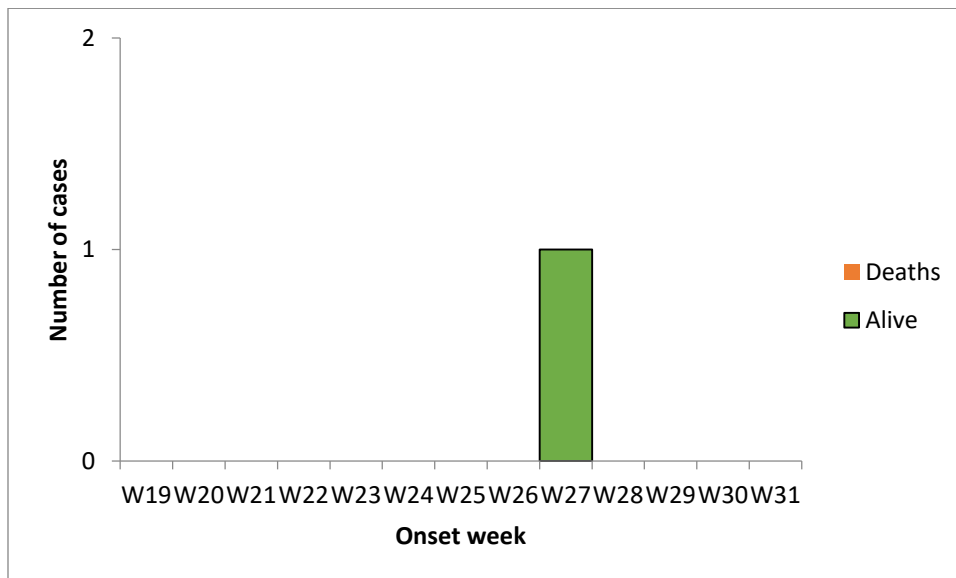


Figure 6: Weekly Epi-curve of suspected cholera case in Song, Adamawa State (weeks 19-31)

Coordination

- A grand stakeholders meeting held in Yola North LGA where the LGA chairman, councilor, all ward leaders, traditional leaders, state ministry of health, WHO and all other partners gathered and discussed ways to overcome challenges faced in this current cholera outbreak response especially the reported resistance to chlorination of water points in affected communities.

Case Management

- 16 admissions and 11 discharges at the CTC

Surveillance

- WHO supported ACS teams visited a total of 1,824 households. A total of 28,661 households have been visited since the commencement of the response.

WASH

- UNICEF supported house to house hygiene promoters reached 149 households and 1,107 people with key hygiene messages in Girei and Yola North LGAs.
- UNICEF distributed 760 pieces of Soap, 50 pieces of 25 liters JERICANS and 17,880 Aquatab tablets during house to house hygiene promotion.
- UNICEF chlorinated 4,420 liters of water in 8 water points at Girei and Yola North LGAs.
- UNICEF disinfected/sprayed 140 households and 283 household latrines/dump sites.
- UNICEF disinfected the CTC admission rooms and surrounding environment.
- IRC supported house to house hygiene promoters reached 1,161 households and 8,588 persons with key hygiene messages and pasted 11 small banners having cholera prevention messages across Girei, Yola North and Yola South LGAs.
- IRC disinfected 22 public waste disposal sites, 151 HHs latrines.
- IRC chlorinated 42,220 liters of water in 6 water points and monitored FRC's at household level of Girei LGA.
- IRC Supplied additional IEC materials to the CTC
- IRC is spraying the CTU twice daily and have plumbed the wastewater from the CTC to a gutter
- IOM supported house to house hygiene promoters reached 356 households and 1,419 people with Key Hygiene messages in Yola North LGA.
- IOM chlorinated 41,089 liters of water in 4 water points of Yola North LGA.

Risk Communication

- UNICEF conducted screening and training of a total of 100 Unicef supported hygiene promoters from Yola North (45), Yola South (25) and Girei (30) LGA on Tuesday, 30th July, 2019.
- UNICEF released of 200 Cholera Flip Charts to Adamawa from Borno and distributed to 130 engaged hygiene promoters in Song, Yola North, Yola South, and Girei LGA.
- UNICEF produced 30 large size Cholera Banners.
- UNICEF is conducting public awareness campaign via radio broadcasts in Fombina FM and Pulaako FM.
- UNICEF had an advocacy visit and meeting with the District Head of Yola and his entire cabinet on Tuesday, 30th July, 2019 at the district heads palace.
- UNICEF WASH department distributed 6 cartons of Aquatabs to Unicef Hygiene Promoter
- UNICEF conducted a joint training for all the three affected LGAs(Yola North, Yola South and Girei)

- UNICEF deployed 130 volunteers to fufore, Yola Noth, Yola South, Girei and Song.
- ICRC supported house to house hygiene promoters reached 1,339 households (13,896 persons) with key hygiene messages in Girei, Yola South and Yola North LGAs.
- WHO supported community health champions visited 2,995 households, sensitized, 5554 people and distributed 7,168 aquatabs to households without access to chlorinated water. Since the onset of their response, the community health champions have visited 21,569 households and sensitized 44,144 people

Logistics:

- Rescue Committee(IRC) supplied 7 pairs of rubber gum boot, 4 pcs of Spraying overall, 20 packs of examination gloves, 10 packs of face masks (10packs/50), 10 pcs of nose masks, 6 pcs of foot mat, and 7. 5 kg 70% HTH chlorine powder. IRC also follow up regularly with the store to know the stock level.
- IMO supplied 20 discharge kits with each containing 2 pcs of sanitary pads, 15 blisters of aqua tabs, 2 pcs of Water kettles, 2pcs of 10 metres rope, 2 pcs of Buckets, 7 pcs of laundry soap, 7 pcs of batting soap.
- WHO supplied 5 boxes of Cholera test kits, Data tools (5booklets) and fuel for generator
UNICEF supplied 20 cartons of aqua tabs
- JHF supplied 10 bags of sachet water
