

AFGHANISTAN: Cross-Border Movement from Pakistan (as of 7 September 2015)

In June 2014, military operations in North Waziristan Agency (NWA) in Pakistan led to the displacement of some 300,000 people to surrounding districts of Khost and Paktika in Afghanistan. The border and population remains fluid with refugees crossing in and out of Afghanistan on a regular basis. UNHCR is currently undertaking a re-verification process. As of 7 September, the total re-verified active caseload is 36,206¹ families (224,087 individuals) with 24,670 families (164,796 individuals) in Khost and 11,536 families (59,291 individuals) in Paktika.

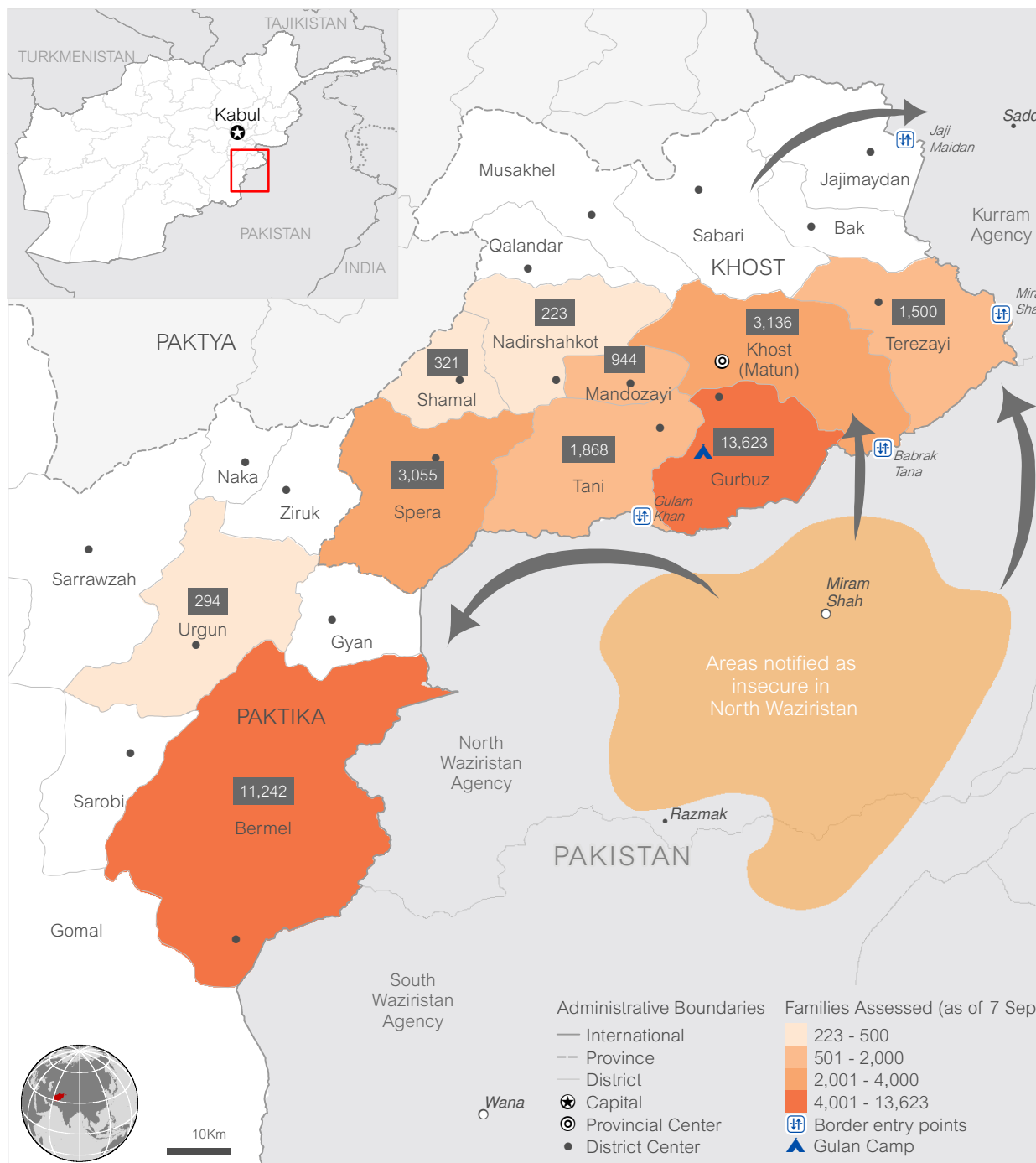
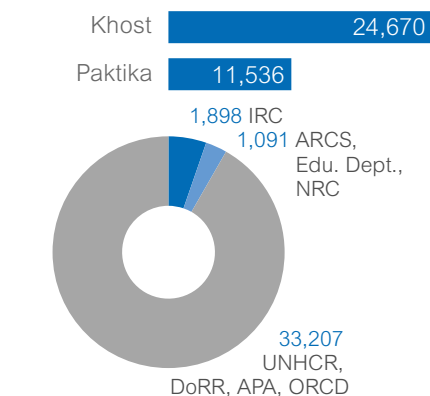
Approximately 10,500 families, or 29 per cent of the total re-verified families are accommodated in Gulam camp, while 31 per cent are living with host families straining the already limited resources of under-served communities.

Funding constraints have impacted the refugee response with humanitarian actors only able to meet the most urgent protection needs, including basic camp management.

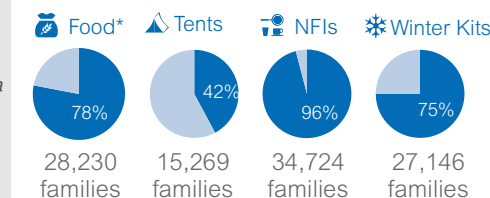

- 27,146 families have received winter assistance
- 186,000 children under 10 vaccinated, including 72,000 at border points
- 3.35 sq. km area cleared of mines; 80,700 individuals provided with mine risk education.
- 2,683 individuals benefiting from cash for work programmes
- Around 17,000 hygiene kits, 2,000 emergency latrine kits and 1,760 female hygiene kits distributed. 6,300 people were provided hygiene education.
- 9.6 million litres of drinking water supplied (as of 11 June).
