

AFGHANISTAN: Cross-Border Movement from Pakistan (as of 20 January 2016)

In June 2014, military operations in North Waziristan Agency (NWA) in Pakistan led to the displacement of some 300,000 people to surrounding districts of Khost and Paktika Provinces in Afghanistan. The border and population remains fluid with refugees crossing in and out of Afghanistan on a regular basis. As of 31 December, the total re-verified active caseload was 38,666¹ families, with 26,570 families in Khost and 12,096 families in Paktika.

Approximately 11,070 families, or 29 per cent of the total re-verified families are accommodated in Gulam camp, while 31 per cent are living with host families which continues to strain the already limited resources of under-served communities.

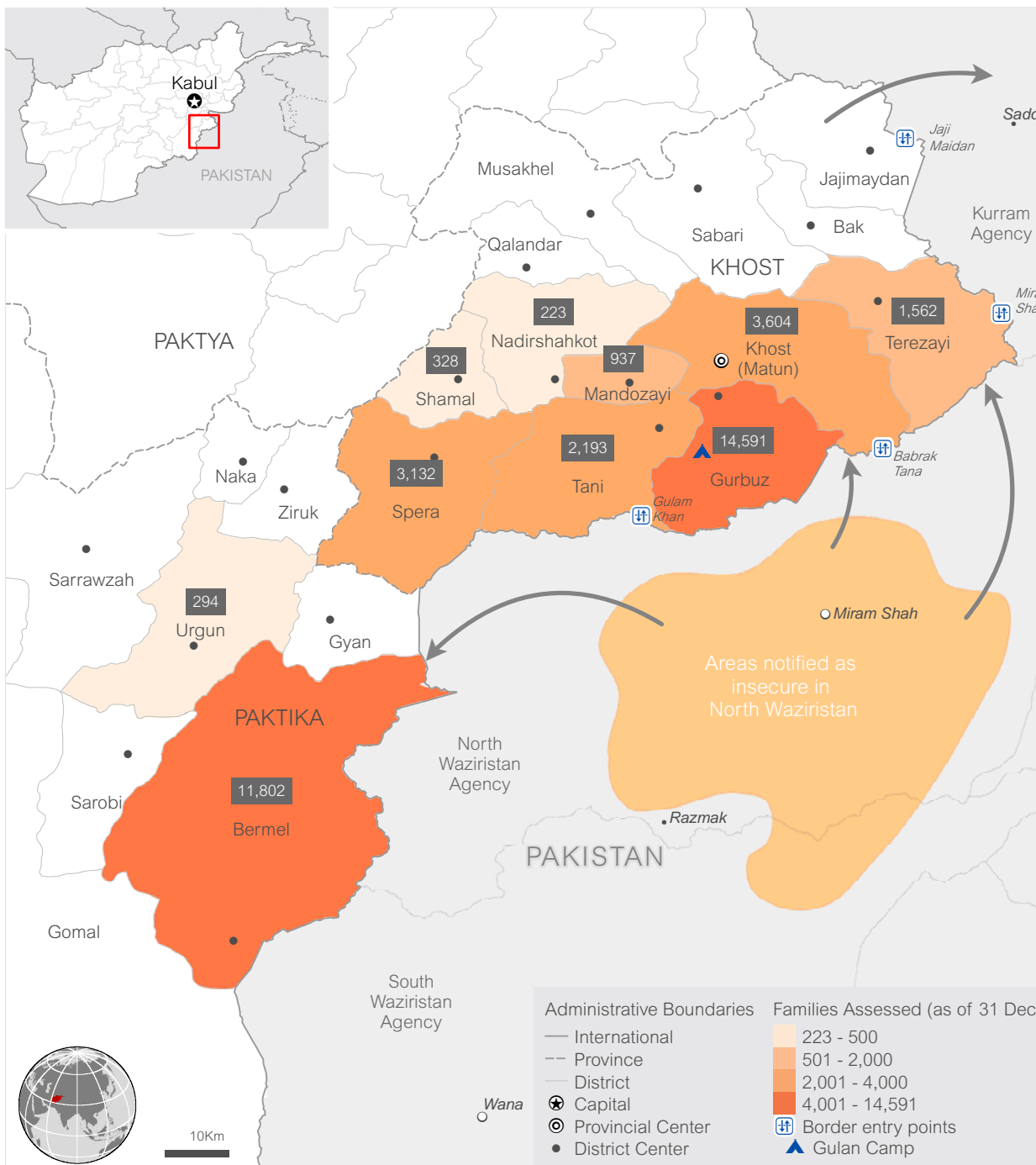

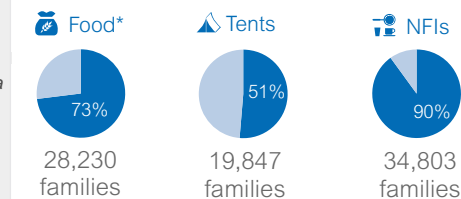
