Updates from WASH Cluster	<p>The cluster presented:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Funding Status: the cluster is 66% funded as of end-November 2018</li> <li>- Achievements against targets per HRP objectives and indicators</li> <li>- HRP 2019 Status: the document is finalized and waiting for publication</li> <li>- HRP 2019 project project proposals: 49 projects reviewed by the review team which is consisting of some of the SAG members and other members, 26 projects were approved with a total final budget of \$75m.</li> <li>- 2019 IHF 1<sup>st</sup> standard allocation: 7 projects reviewed, most of them were not in consortiums, 2 projects were in consortiums and were considered for 2019 implementation with at total budget of \$5m. EJCC Update	<p>EJCC to manage the water and sanitation facilities and services in IDP s camps, in Erbil Governorate in 6 IDPs camps Khazir M1 , Hasan Sham U 3 , Bahrka , Harsham ,Debaga 1 and Debaga 2 IDPs camps . The Scope of the services include.</p> <p>1-Water supply system management, operation and maintenance of all water systems 2- Solid Waste Management. 3- Operation and Maintenance of the sanitation Systems. 5-A- Hygiene promotion implementation, IDPs to be aware of key public health risks and to use and maintain the facilities provided. 5-B- The IDPs have access to and promoting the use of hygiene items to ensure personal hygiene, health, dignity and well-being.</p> <p>These activities will be managed by hiring services from the private parties available within the locality as well as by mobilizing services from Directorate of Erbil Surrounding Water. EJCC manages this work under UNICEF support and in intimate coordination with Camp Management, other partners in the camp and the beneficiaries.
