2. Assessment Finding and Recommendation in brief:

OCT members reviewed and had interviewed with 983 Applicants and 177 out of 983 IDPs households referred to joint assessment and assistance these households were displaced from Insecure areas of Badakhshan, Badghis, Baghlan, Faryab, Ghazni, Ghor, Jawzjan, Kunduz, Laghman, Logar, Nangarhar, Paktya, Takhar, Uruzgan and Wardak provinces. Above stated Organizations conducted a joint assessment from 19th to 27th of December 2018. Joint assessment teams went door to door and interviewed with the head and the family members of the IDP HHs as well as neighbors and finally after

comparing with the consolidated Database they identified 66 eligible households for assistance. The identified households' breakdown indicated in below table:

Needs: HEAT database shows the following three priority needs of the identified families:

- Food
- NFI (kitchen kit, bedding items and cooking items, fuel).
- Cash

Response Plan: Response to this caseload coordinated among the OCT members and agreed upon following;

- WFP will cover food needs for all 66 Households.
- DRC will provide MPCA based on SMEB to identified households.
- WASH needs will cover by DACAAR ERM WASH partner.

3. Sectorial Issues:

A) Food Security, Nutrition and Livelihood: *(provide detailed information about the impact of food security and livelihood i.e. lost/damaged food stock, current food stock statues, income sources, damaged/destroyed crops and agricultural land, type of agricultural land, agricultural inputs availability, diet diversity, irrigation system, livestock etc. Also describe immediate food and nutritional need and provide recommendation about the short and long term food and nutrition assistance)*

Main source of livelihood of the IDPs and affected families in their place of origin were agriculture, livestock and daily wage activities. In current locations main source of income for 38% IDPs is daily unskilled labor which is not regularly available, 56% Jobless when five HHs are female headed HH, three families are with disability and one another is a child headed HH. Average monthly income (AFN 6358 dropped to AFN 1430, in addition, debts level of 35 families is more than 8000 AFN, for 27 families Between AFN 2000 AFN/8000, for one Family it less than AFN 2000 and for the remaining families reported no debts.

Currently 30 families have no food stock, 22 families with less than a week food stock and 14 other HHs with 1 to 3 weeks' food stock. To cope with current situation, IDPs have diverted to negative coping strategies such as consumption of less preferred food, barrowing food from relatives.

Markets are well functioning, available and accessible for all IDP families.

Recommendation: Cash for food or in-kind food distribution is recommended for all 66 households.

Response Plan: WFP committed to cover two months' food need through provision of in-kind.

HEAT database shows that all families are in shortage of NFI. During household survey IDPs reported that they could not bring their household items during displacemnet. Currently most of the IDPs have

no access to adequate household items and suffer from lack of NFIs, particularly kitchen, cooking, bedding items and carpet. Below breakdown indicates NFIs need among the IDP families.

Recommendation: Full NFIs kit is recommended by assessment teams for all 66 IDP families.

Response Plan: ERM assistance package include cost for standard NFI kit, which can be used for purchasing of NFIs by IDPs as per their choice.

HEAT data indicate that currently 42 IDP HHs live in rented, and 24 remaining HHs live in free of charge and/or hosted/ sharing with friends or relatives houses and some family pay AFN 2327/month in average.

Recommendation: Based on ERM's SMEB package of MPCA include cost for basic shelter support which can be used for small repairs, contribution to rent cost and improvements of the current shelters.

Response Plan: IDP HHs can use a part of MPCA for shelter rent during the coming winter.


According to HEAT data, all 66 identified families have access to adequate water for drinking, cooking and bathing. 15 families consume water from Hand pump, 48 families consume tap water, whilst 3 families consume paid water trucking. Average distance between IDPs houses and water source is 2 minutes on foot.

61 families have access to family latrines, while 5 other IDP HHs have no latrine access.

During household survey assessment teams observed poor hygiene conditions among some IDP HHs due to lack of awareness and insufficient hygiene items.

Recommendations: Provision of hygiene kits and hygiene messages to all 66 households.

Response Plan: DACAAR will cover WASH needs of all 66 families.

Below additional vulnerabilities reported during household assessment:

- Elderly headed household- 11



- Female headed household- 5
- Child headed Household- 1
- Disability- 3
- Chronically ill- 3

Recommendation: Further follow up on people with additional vulnerabilities or People with Specific needs.

Response Plan: DRC protection team will follow the additional vulnerabilities among the IDP HHs and will refer to the relevant services provider for further and specific support.

Health facilities (public and private) are available and accessible for all IDPs in all parts of Kabul city as well as district level, and there were no serious diseases reported during assessment.

Recommendation: NA

Response Plan: ERM MPC assistance include a small amount of cash for health related expenditures.

E) MARKET ASSESSMENT: *(provide summary information regarding the local market, accessibility, security constrains and fill the table if a market assessment has been conducted)*

All families have access to market and *average* distance to the market is 1.4 KM or 15 minutes on foot. A short market assessment conducted (in Kot-e Sangi area) close to IDPs location. Markets are available and functioning with adequate food and NFIs. There are no concerns regarding the lack of food and NFI items in the market.

Residential houses' rent in IDPs' locations are between AFN 4000 AFN to 8000 depending on location, size and condition of the rental houses. Daily wage rate varies from 300 to 350 AFN (depending on location and type of work).

4. Urgent Priority needs of affected people (as per affected point of view)

Needs: IDPs have prioritized their top 3 needs as per following

- 66 HHs (100%) stated food as their first priority.
- 65 HHs (98 %) stated NFIs as their second priority.
- 48 HHs (73 %) stated Cash as third priority.

Response plan:

- DRC will distribute MPCA cash AFN 16000/HH (full SMEB) to 58 the most vulnerable families in Cat-A and AFN 5000/HH to 8 HHs in Cat-B in one instalment.
- WFP will cover food need through provision of food items for two months to all identified HHs.
- WASH need will be covered by DACAAR ERM WASH Partner.
