

EXAMPLES OF CLUSTER INDICATORS

This paper provides some good examples of Cluster indicators and targets, that can be used in a Humanitarian Response Plan (HRP) and Humanitarian Response Monitoring Framework. These indicators may be attached to a Cluster Objective, and/or to a Cluster Activity.

Those indicators related to people should be disaggregated by sex and age.

WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE
