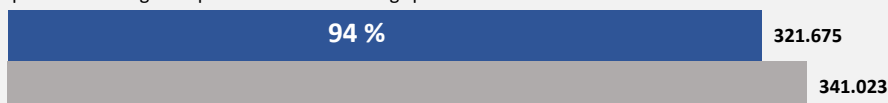

5,745 (46 % female) Teachers and education personnel benefited from education interventions provided through the partners in 660 learning spaces across 15 districts



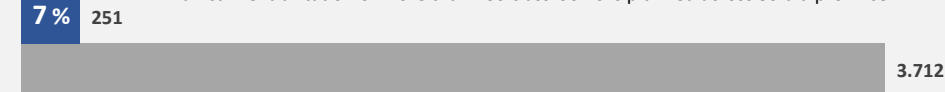
3,712 Classrooms



Nearly 4,000 classrooms in 1372 schools across 5 provinces were either partially or completely damaged requiring either minor or major rehabilitation (updated from *damaged classroom in Sofala, Manica, Tete, Zambezia and Inhambane provinces - PDNA May 2019*)

TOTAL OF CLASSROOMS REHABILITATED AS OF 29 NOVEMBER 2019

251 Classrooms rehabilitated; 218 in 99 schools in 4 districts across Sofala, and 33 classrooms in 4 schools in one district in Manica. Rehabilitation of 147 classrooms ongoing in Sofala and 15 classrooms in Manica. Rehabilitation of more than 200 classrooms is planned across Sofala province.



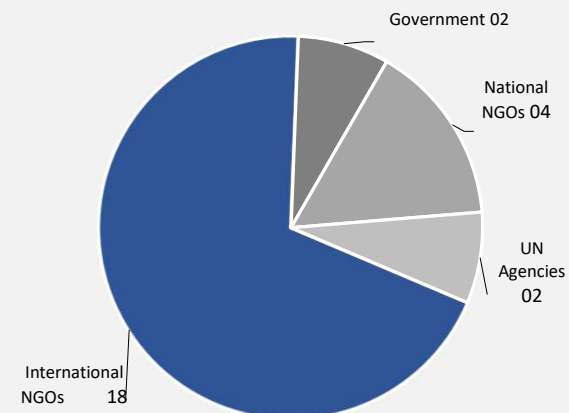
Mozambique Education Cluster
