Galmudug Sub-national Nutrition Cluster Meeting Minutes

15th August 2017, 10:00am, Cesvi Meeting Hall, Galkayo, Somalia

Absent with Apology: DEH, CISP, UNICEF, RAWA

1. Welcome, Introductions and registration - (5 minutes) all partners

Meeting was chaired by Ahmed Dahir who has thanked the participants for their punctual participation, invited them to introduce themselves, and proceeded with the next agendas.

2. Review of the last cluster meeting minutes and action points (10 min) cluster focal point

The cluster focal point has reviewed the last cluster meeting minutes and the agreed action points for endorsement.

3. Nutrition programme updates, supplies and challenges

CESVI

Cesvi is running three nutrition projects in Galkayo IDPs and rural areas of Mudug region

UNICEF Funded- Rural project

In July, we achieved to:

- Admit 163 children (84 boys and 79 girls), making the a total of 2046 admission since the beginning of the project (64% of the set target which is 3214 admissions).
- Out of the 111 admitted children, 31 were admitted through MUAC and 132 were admitted through Z-score (81%)
- The agency achieved to cure 196 children(106 boys and 92 girls), making a total of 1587 children since start of the project(763 boys and 824 girls)
- In July, there was 8 children who defaulted from the program; and 9 children were transferred to Stabilization centres run by CESVI and IMC
- The agency achieved to screen 988 children (513 boys and 475 girls); out of the screened children 31 were SAM, 375 were MAM and 582 were normal.
- The agency achieved to provide Vitamin A and Deworming to to 212 children(110 boys and 102 girls), provide Zinc sulphate to 51 children(30 boys and 21 girls), provided Amoxicillin syrup to 130 children(58 boys and 72 girls); total children supported 393 children
- The agency provided MMN to 533 PLWs, provided ferrofolic iron supplementation to 715 pregnant mothers, provided 297 Pregnant women with Albendazole after reaching the 4th month, provided vitamin A to 127 post-natal mothers; total mothers supported are 1672.
- The agency provided IYCF awareness and counselling to 3522 mothers

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- The agency chaired the routine nutrition cluster meeting and rolled out the cluster meeting minutes.

The 50 community health workers in the IDPs have screened 5727 children out of those 40 were SAM with MUAC less than 11.5cm; CHWs also provided IYCF counselling to 5735 women

SHF Funded- IDPs project:

- In July, Cesvi achieved to screen 1887 children(951 boys and 936 girls); out of those children screened, 150 were SAM(8%), 720 were MAM(38%) and 1017 were normal(53%).
- Out of the screened children, the agency admitted 293 children(151 boys and 142 girls) which makes the total of admitted children into 856(64%).
- Furthermore, the agency also discharged 138 children as cured(65 boys and 73 girls) making the total children cured into 506 children
- Two children defaulted from the program, making the total defaulter rate into 13 since the inception of the project
- The agency achieved to refer 103 sick children to IMC using ambulance referral voucher system
- The agency also achieved to refer 118 cured children to IMC (Alanley 24, Arafat 58 and Haarhaar 36) for admitting in the BSFP program which will continue to 6 months to prevent relapse of cases
- In July, the agency achieved to provide Micronutrient supplementation to 487 PLWs, Ferrofollic tablets to 487 PLWs and Deworming tablets for the second trimester and onwards for 46 PLWs; total of 1020 PLWs, making the project achieved 68% of the set target which is 1960 PLWs
- in July, the agency achieved to provide 422 children(199 boys and 223 girls) to vitamin A and deworming making the project achieve 22% of the set target; we are under-performing in the indicator but with the remaining month and a half we expect to reach the remaining 3617(602 children per week)
- In July, the agency provided IYCF awareness and counselling to 309 women and 42 men in Galkayo IDPs, making the project achieve 75% of the set target
- In July, the 30 CHWs in the IDPs screened 1642 children, out of those 52 were MUAC less than 11.5cm.
- Furthermore, the CHWs provided IYCF and NHHP counselling to 1649 mothers in June

DFID Funded- rural nutrition project

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Achievements in IRF Health and nutrition project include:

- Securing of RUTF and RUSF supplies for OTP and TSFP(240 cartons of RUTF and 430 cartons of RUSF)
- Furthermore, additional 800 cartons of RUSF have been delivered from Garowe to GLK
- We have distributed the guidelines to the nutrition teams
- We attended nutrition cluster meeting and shared achievements, challenges and plans with MoH and other partners
- We have conducted field monitoring together with other Cesvi projects

IMC

IMC is running OTP and SC program in Galkayo hospital funded by ECHO with in-kind support from UNICEF, as well as BSFP program from USAID Fund in south Galkayo villages for both IDPs and Host community. The BSFP program duration is from April to November 2017.

SC and OTP

In the month of July the total **161** children were admitted in both SC and OTP program (**108** SC and **53** OTP) while **208** of children were discharged as cured (**127** SC and **81** OTP).

The Community health workers have reached 486 individuals with health, hygiene and Nutrition Promotion.

They have screened **1,923** of under-fives and **307** PLWs. **159** among the total children screened were SAM cases, **154** MAM and **1,610** Normal.

Also **325** care-takers were reached with IYCF Counselling at both facility and community level.

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872 Inpatient and care takers have benefited two hot meals followed by porridge for TB patients provided by IMC for all inpatients.

Number of VIT A to 6-59 months: **23**

Deworming tablets to 6-59 months: **13**

BSFP

This project is targeting children who are not malnourished but are in at risk of malnutrition from 6-36 months, as well as children who have been discharged as cured from the OTP programs (6-59 months old).

The target number of children that have been reached by the BSFP program is, 8329(90%) of the set target have been reached. In July **2294** children were reached.

IMC will launch new OTP program to current 10 PHUs and Dhuure Health Center through OFDA funding from July 2017 to June 2018.

Mercy USA

Mercy USA is running OTP, TSFP and MCHN program in Hobyo district.

OTP and SC

In the OTP, the previously 218 children were in the program, new admission are 97 children while 131 children were cured and currently there are 183 children in the program.

In the SC, 5 children were in the program, 8 children were admitted, 7 were cured and 6 are now in program

TSFP and MCHN

In July, 4201 children and 3109 PLWs were served with TSFP rations.

New admission: under-five children 254 and 72 PLWs.

Cured: 209 children and 70 PLWs.

MCHN program: 4000 children(2061 male and 1939 female) and 1538 PLWs were provided with the MCHN rations.

SDRO

SDRO is running 4 nutrition projects namely OTP, TSFP, BSFP and MCHN in partnership with WFP, UNICEF and SHF.

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In the **TSFP** program, new admissions for July are 1309 children and 1507 PLWs (total 2816)

The number of children who are discharged: 960 children and 1500 PLWs.

MCHN program: 901 children and 3507 PLWs were admitted, while 901 children and 503 PLWs were discharged as cured.

In the **BSFP** program, 4000 children under 3 years were supported in July.

SHF Funded- 5 site project in Hobyo and Galkayo district:

SDRO July achievements

- Number of children screened: 936 children(164 were SAM, 274 were MAM and 498 were normal)
- New Admission 164 children
- Discharges 137 while 1 child defaulted
- Number of beneficiaries provided IYCF awareness and counselling are 205 women
- PLW received Iron folate and MM supplements 250
- Number of beneficiaries provided NHHP practice 191

CISP

In Elder District we are in Gap from July EPI, Nutrition program and we are waiting for approval our new PCA.

but in Harardere we have not any nutrition programs and we discussed with UNICEF and still waiting feedback.

RAWA

RAWA is running TSFP program in Harardheere district and surrounding villages in partnership with WFP. The project is covering 9 villages under Harardheere district.

In the month of July the target beneficiaries were 8070 beneficiaries (5170 children and 2900 PLWs).

Achievement in July is: new admission of 1685 beneficiaries (831 children and 854 PLWs), Discharge of Cured 1266 beneficiaries (624 children and 642 PLWs), Discharged as non-cured are 287 (141 children and 146 PLWs), transfer to OTP program is 42 children.

In the BSFP project, the number of beneficiaries reached are 1799 girls and 1701 boys.

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DEH

Deh Relief is implementing nutrition program funded by UNICEF, WFP and SHF in Ceelbur, Xarardhere and Hobyo districts of Galgadud and Mudug regions, below is the breakdown.

OTP -UNICEF:

DEH screened 1921 children of which 198 children admitted

156 children cured out of 178 of total discharge

Transferred 13 SAM cases with complications to SC

Reached 216 children with vitamin A

Reached 187 PLW with Multiple Micronutrient supplementation

42 PLW received IYC counselling

OTP – SHF:

4028 children of which 460 children admitted

294 children cured out of 328 of total discharge

Transferred 15 SAM cases with complications to SC

Reached 421 children with vitamin A

Reached 105 PLW with Multiple Micronutrient supplementation

TSFP/BSFP/MCHN – WFP:

1128 girls, 972 boys and 1125 PLW where reached with TSFP rations

1223 girls and 1277 boys reached with BSFP rations

2055 girls, 1945 boys, 1140 PLW and 45 deliveries where reached with MHCN rations
