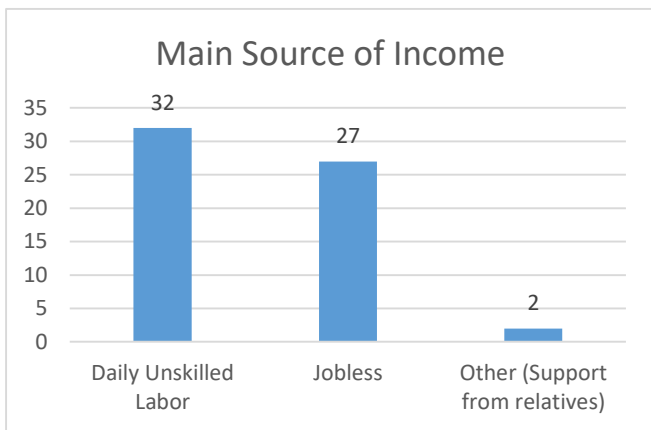
**Response Plan:** Response to this caseload coordinated among OCT members and agreed upon following;

- DRC will provide MPCA based on SMEB to all 61 identified households.
- WASH needs will be covered by DACAAR ERM WASH partner.

**Sectorial Issues:**

A) **Food Security, Nutrition and Livelihood:** *(provide detailed information about the impact of food security and livelihood i.e. lost/damaged food stock, current food stock statues, income sources, damaged/destroyed crops and agricultural land, type of agricultural land, agricultural inputs availability, diet diversity, irrigation system, livestock etc. Also describe immediate food and nutritional need and provide recommendation about the short and long term food and nutrition assistance)*

The food security situation of the IDPs population is fragile and closely linked to livelihood opportunities, which are limited. Currently some heads of the households are engaged in daily unskilled labor and while many are jobless, and their physical laboring is not marketable in the current place of displacement due to extreme and cold weather condition. Households using different coping strategies to meet their food needs, IDPs reported that they relied on less preferred and less expensive food, limited portion size at meal times, borrowed, reduced number of meals for adults especially parents were consuming less food to feed their small children.



Majority (54%) of the respondents (33 HHs) reported having no food stock, while 46% (28 HHs) having food stock less than a week. In addition, debts level of 49 families is more than 8000 AFN, while the remaining families has less than AFN 8000. Average monthly income has dropped significantly since displacement. (from AFN 7975 dropped to AFN 1530). Local markets are well functioning, available and accessible for all IDP families.

**Recommendation:** Cash for food or in-kind is recommended for all 61 HHs.

**Response Plan:** DRC will provide cash for food for two months to cover basic food need.

During households assessment the IDPs reported that they couldn't take their essential items when they left their homes. During assessment the IDPs reported that they needed kitchen equipment, fuel, warm clothes, blankets, water container and hygiene supplies.

Below is the breakdown for NFIs needs.

**Recommendation:** Provision of full package of NFIs in kind or cash for NFIs to all 61 households of IDPs as part of standard NFI package.

**Response Plan:** DRC will provide cash for NFIs, the cost of NFIs is included in the proposed MPCA package.

B) **Shelter:** *(please provide detailed information about the status of shelter condition i.e. type of normal shelters, # of shelters moderately damaged, severely damaged and completely destroyed by crises. 37 households reported living in rented shelter with an average rent of 1876 AFN per month per household, 24 households are hosted free of charge sheltered in houses provided to them by community or relatives for short period of time.

**Recommendation:** No need for emergency shelter, as no household were reported with open area. However, shelter support beyond considered.

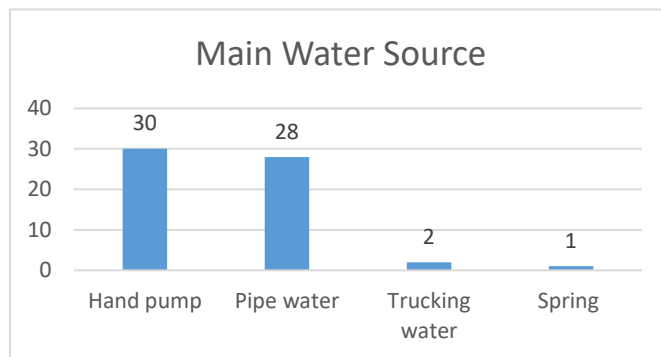
**Response Plan:** ERM multipurpose cash package include small amount for shelter support, which can be used for minor improvement of current shelters or contribution of rent cost.

HEAT database shows that all 61 households have accesses to enough water which illustrated in the following table:

30 families consume water from Hand pump, 28 families consume tap water, 2 families use tanker water whilst 1 family consume spring water. Average distance between IDPs houses and water source is 5 minutes' walk. 59 household have access to latrine and bathing facilities, whilst 2 households don't have access to latrine facility and currently practice open defecation.



**Recommendation:** Provision of hygiene kits and hygiene messages to all 61 households.

**Response Plan:** DACAAR will cover WASH needs for the identified 61 households.

Below additional vulnerabilities reported during household assessment:

- Elderly headed household- 4
- Female headed household- 9
- Child headed Household- 1
- Disability- 7
- Chronically ill- 6

**Recommendation:** Further follow up on people with additional vulnerabilities or People with Specific needs.

**Response Plan:** DRC protection team will follow up on additional vulnerabilities among the IDP HHs and will refer to the relevant services provider for further and specific support.

**Health:** *(provide information about health issues, damaged/destroyed health facilities, current/available health facilities, access to health services and recommended assistance in this regards)*

Private and public health facilities are available in all parts of Kabul City as well as district level where IDPs are currently sheltered. Mentioned health facilities are accessible to all IDP families. No serious disease after displacement reported/observed during door to door visits among the assessed IDP families.

**Recommendation:** NA, ERM MPCA can be used for basic health related expenditures.

E) **MARKET ASSESSMENT:** *(provide summary information regarding the local market, accessibility, security constrains and fill the table if a market assessment has been conducted)*

All families have access to market located within *average* distance of 1.4 KM or 14 minutes' walk. A light market assessment conducted in Kot-e Sangi, Bagh Qazi and Campani locations. Markets are available and functioning with adequate food and NFIs. There were no concerns regarding lack of food and non-food items in the market. Residential houses' rent in IDPs' locations are between AFN 4000 AFN to 7000 depending on location, size and condition of the rental houses. Daily wage rate vary from 300 to 350 AFN (depending on location and type of work).
