DSWD Update on NIAC	<p>DRMB share the following updates during the meeting:</p> <p>After the discussion with NCPWG co-chairs, DRMB had a meeting with partners from Save the Children to discuss the recommendation to dissolve the NIAC.</p> <p>A position paper was approved by the Working Group Members within the DSWD (represented by different DSWD bureaus/offices).</p> <p>The NCPWG members initially agreed with the recommendation to dissolve the NIAC noting the roles and institutional arrangements. NCPWG will perform its functions as a member of the protection sub cluster and will primarily work on the promotion and advocacy on pieces related to child protection while the DSWD should include in the position paper their roled as lead in the CEPC implementation and the coordination mechanism with other clusters to address the remaining concerns.</p>	DRMB to send a copy of the signed position paper to the NIAC members as well as to the NCPWG members, for information.
Guidelines on Family Tracing and Reunification	<p>The DSWD STB presented updates during the meeting. The pilot implementation guidelines were approved in 2020. The pilot-testing the FTR guidelines is in Regions V, VI, VIII, and XII.</p> <p>The STB representation in the NCPWG will now be handed-over to the Pilot Implementation Division as the focal office on the pilot-testing.</p> <p>FTR will not only be limited for children but for general population. It is envisioned that the FTR will not only be limited to emergency context but will be embedded to DSWD regular programs.</p>	NCPWG to support the finalization of the FTR guidelines
Presentation of the RCPWG Rolling Workplan	<p>The RCPWG focals presented a consolidated workplan with their 2021 priority activities and requested the support of NCPWG members as resource persons.</p> <p>As part of continuous capacity building for N/RCPWG on CPiE, the members agreed to complete available online courses.
