<p>Group work session to discuss experiences, challenges, successes and learning points from the 2018 health programming</p>	<p>General Strengths</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -IERT approach enabled wholesome service provision for hard to reach areas -Slight improvement of funding situation and cash programming was a key enabling factor for project implementation -More areas opened up for access -Improved infrastructure e.g. Doblely airstrip now opened -Improved coordination -Improved leadership and governance <p>Challenges</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Need for improved coordination of assessments -Improve use of guidelines -Insecurity and inaccessibility is still a challenge despite the slight improvement in 2018 - Vaccination coverage is mostly inclined to campaigns and not routine -Donor fatigue - Policy level overlap - Limited public health expenditure -Poor case management at hospital level - Policy level overlap <p>Increased number of IDPs in Benadir</p>	<p>Learning Points</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Focus more on public private partnerships -Advocate for routine immunisation e.g by using issuance of birth certificate as an incentive -Further strengthen leadership and governance at state level - Continuous case management trainings <p>Suggested Trainings</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Continuous case management training -Training on reporting and investigation of diseases -Mental health and psychosocial support -Community health hygiene promotion -DHIS 2 training
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<p>Update on information Management from FMOH Head of Coordination and Communication: Dr Mohamed Hersi</p>	<p>Dr Hersi update the health cluster partners on the efforts of the FMOH in contributing to information management of health activities across the country. He further mentioned that the FMOH desires to know what health partners are doing on ground, what their achievements, challenges and strengths are. Since there are currently very few partners reporting to FMOH, Dr Hersi suggested the use of the DHIS 2 to report to FMOH on health activities, and that all parallel reporting systems should be integrated within the DHIS2</p>	<p>-Share DHIS2 template with partners -Cluster and FMOH to crosscheck the indicators presented in ReportHub and decide if it is sufficient to meet indicator needs</p>
<p>Update on upcoming cluster activities</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - All partners to start reporting on the ReportHub effective Feb 2019 - There will be no more weekly reports. - 3ws shall be reported on 3 months basis, since there usually isn't much change in activities every month - The cluster is working on mental health and psychosocial working group together with the protection cluster - Discussions are ongoing on cash programing in health, and further details will be shared when available 	<p>Partners to start reporting on ReportHub</p>
