<p><b>Brief on Covid-19 response</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• ECW is the only active funding currently active for the covid-19 response, the FERs – PI, SC, UNICEF, SCI - have received \$1million of a \$2 million proposed response based on the sector’s covid-19 response strategy. The second phase is expected in the coming months.</li> <li>• The larger aspects of the response are implementing distance learning mechanisms and keeping children engaged during school closures. Some radio learning initiatives have already begun, as of May 4<sup>th</sup> a radio station in Maiduguri, 98.1FM started holding 2 classes on learning and 3 more will start after Ramadan.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Sector Secretariat to share list of the members of the TWG and the ToR for the TWG.</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The CV19-TWG has also focused on the establishment of safe return to school guidelines and advocacy for continuing to keep schools as places of learning and were possible trying not to let schools be used as isolation centers.</li> <li>• Membership to the CV19-TWG is currently not open, however, the TWG is working with all partners in the EiEWG regardless of being part of the TWG or not.</li> </ul>

Partners that require support with maneuvering the platform can reach out bilaterally to the sector IM.</li> <li>• DTM R31: IOM has published the new DTM report, data for the DTM was collected between 15<sup>th</sup> January – 15<sup>th</sup> February 2020. In summary there is an estimated 800,000 children (3-17) IDP children living in IDP camps and host communities. AOB	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Partner Updates: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ USAID-AENN has several packages for 45,000 learners across 225 communities in Yobe and Borno States. This includes SMS to the caregivers to guide learners on protection, psychosocial support, literacy and numeracy. Whatsapp is also used to engage with the CBOs, master trainers and several other stakeholders. Interactive radio instruction developed in line with the curriculum, Home learning kits, interactive voice response for the passage of sensitization messages. Guidelines are being developed for the delivery of home learning kits.</li> <li>○ GSF has a CP/EiE response focusing on the re-opening of schools, working with children who are at risk of dropping out of school due to the pandemic. Sensitization of teachers is also being planned in consultation with SUBEB.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• EiEWG is currently working on a guideline for the re-opening of schools and a draft document is ready.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• AENN to share details of their projects and the list of the 225 communities with the sector secretariat.</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Partners are encouraged to report all their activities on the agreed sector reporting tool.</li><li>• The HPC was re-opened for the addendum of the 2021 HRP. More than 25 projects were submitted, and a total of 16 projects were approved.</li><li>• Partners interested in joining an advocacy network for the safety of schools are encouraged to send an email to <a href="mailto:benjaminjohn@restorationofhopeinitiative.org">benjaminjohn@restorationofhopeinitiative.org</a></li><li>• The 2021 HPC process has begun.
