<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • GBV Trends Presentation for EiE – GBVIMS 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • GBV Situation Update January – June 2020 (Mid-year report). • GBVIMS and Information Caveat – a global inter-agency partnership to; <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Harmonize GBV data produced through service delivery in humanitarian settings ○ Help facilitate safe and ethical data sharing between agencies to help Inform the humanitarian community’s response to GBV. ○ Data shared reflects incidents and not prevalence. ○ Data is generated by GBV service providers with the consent of survivors. With about 11 partners reporting in the BAY States. ○ Data cannot be used for follow-up ○ GBVIMS has an active Information Sharing Protocol (ISP). • GBV Trends with focus on children – <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ 21% of reported incidents are from children. ○ 29% of cases reported by children were made by unaccompanied and separated children. ○ Child survivors reported early child marriage 6% and child sexual abuse 10%. ○ Early marriage is difficult to discuss in the community due to its sensitivity, programming focuses on girl-child education, however there are accessibility difficulties for education facilities within the hard-to-reach areas. • GBV Response to child survivors, services available – <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ 52% of reported cases were reported by the survivors while 48% were facilitated by a humanitarian or development actor. ○ 97% of survivors are provided with psychosocial services, 25% Health/Medical Services, 15% Livelihoods services, 1% Legal services. • Operational challenges, gaps and recommendations – <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Most GBV programming focus on adults and not specifically children. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Children tend not to be aware of the GBV services available to them. Joint programming efforts between GBV prevention and response in education settings and learning centers needs to be improved. ○ Social norms influence like stigma limits reporting. ○ Few partners are providing GBV services. ○ Lack of partners with comparative advantage in providing GBV case management for child survivors and limited capacity building initiatives for child survivors management (Caring for Child survivors). This needs to be scaled up. ○ Establish and strengthen referral mechanisms in CFS and learning center including safe and confidential channels for reporting.

Partners are encouraged to plan towards the conference and provide support when needed. 	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Update on donors (ECW, GPE, NHF process) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● GPE Accelerated Emergency Funding – A logframe has been developed and will be shared. The fund is 20 million dollars for 18 months. UNICEF is the grant agent and an implementation plan is being developed. Details on how to apply will be shared with all partners when developed. BAY States are not being considered in the other GPE Covid-19 response fund. ● ECW – The MYRP will be in-line with the Multi-year strategy. A consultant has been identified and onboarding will soon begin. The consultant will develop the proposal, once approved by ECW secretariat, a guideline will be developed, and grant agents identified. The envelope has not been disclosed yet. ● CERF – The Humanitarian Coordinator has approved some funding for some sectors. Education funding will be provided through UNICEF and 3 million dollars has been approved by the HC. ● Comments – in-line with the EiEWG localization strategy, National NGOs will be allocated a percentage in all funding envelopes. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ●
