Whereas by now most of the WTP either rehabilitated or need full rehabilitation and the discussion about WTP rehabilitation were covered by the WASH cluster meeting in the last three months.</p> <p>DOW presented the Water supply network needs in a map which is attached to the MoM, the map shows the Old city where the main secondary pipelines rehabilitation</p>	<p>Nainawa WTP TWG will hold the meeting.</p> <p>DoW to share the list of BoQs with WASH cluster partners.</p>

Keep doing good monitoring water quality and keep update on water quality monitoring Form.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pekawa project presentation on water quality record monitoring: <p>PEWAKA , presented water quality project funded by WHO. Data are attached.</p> <p>Water quality testing regulation was discussed with PEKAWA</p> <p>DoW is undertaking regular water quality control on all parameters. <u>Partners updates</u>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Partners update <p>No challenges reported in relation to the water supply for the water coolers in camps.</p> <p>TDH: Telafar is flagged with urgent needs and gaps in water supply systems.</p> <p>MSF reported challenges in powder chlorine transportation from Baghdad to Mosul.</p> <p>IRD: Rehabilitating two water networks in Zumar and Derbagour village.</p> <p>PWG: is not working inside Mosul, only east Mosul, ongoing extension and rehabilitation in two areas around Bartella and Hamdanyia, supposed to end by end of September</p> <p>CARE: West Mosul, Al Thwara, doing sanitation and HP, working on greywater, sewage system and cleaning campaigns.</p> <p>RNVDO: desalination plants are not functioning.</p> <p>Wash cluster reminds that the standard indicator for water provision at camp level is 50 l/p/d, if partners cannot provide this, AT LEAST PROVIDE 35 l/p/d. Summer season is coming, again, be aware on water borne disease.</p> <p>UNICEF activities in Nainawa governorate:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Completion of water project in Hai Al Arabi in East Mosul for upgrading of water network. The project 100% completed and included installation of 500 m.l of 8” ductile pipe benefiting about 10,000 individual • Upgrading three water network in Old Mosul city total length of 6Km that will benefit about 7,000 individuals. 80% of the project is completed. “No confirmation on Demining by any entity” • Starting from next September UNICEF will reduce the water trucking intervention to 50% (ie: about 300m3 per month) for Old Mosul City neighborhood. • Rehabilitation of WASH facilities in 24 schools are ongoing in Nieneveh Governorate: 8 in Rabea and Zmmar, 10 in Mosul and 16 in Talafar and Ayadiyah, 	<p>TDH to share assessment findings and results.</p> <p>WASH cluster to discuss with logistic Cluster and come back to MSF.</p> <p>RNVDO: share the assessment of desalination plants with Partners.</p>
