# HUMANITARIAN RESPONSE PLAN

ISSUED FEBRUARY 2021

## SUMMARY

The humanitarian crisis in Borno, Adamawa and Yobe (BAY) states in north-east Nigeria is expected to persist in 2021. Ongoing conflict will continue to severely affect millions of people who remain vulnerable to displacement (new or continued), impoverishment and threat of violence. Some 1.92 million people are displaced internally, and 257,000 living as refugees in neighbouring Cameroon, Chad and Niger. The majority (54 per cent) of the internally displaced people (IDPs) are taking shelter across host communities. Borno State hosts 81 per cent of the IDPs, more than half (54 per cent) of whom live in IDP camps.

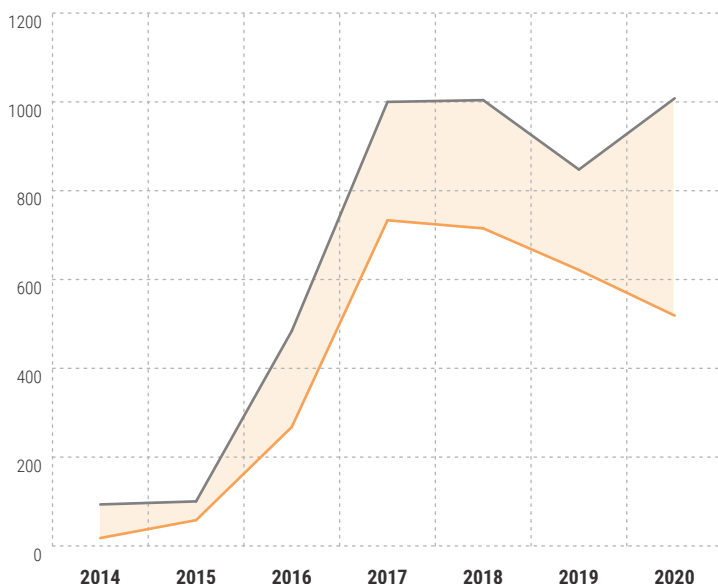

# Strategic Objectives

HRP 2021

Several years into the crisis and with no end in sight, the 2021 segment of the three-year humanitarian strategy must aim for such lasting improvement in affected people's condition as might be possible even while the crisis drivers persist. This should focus on ameliorating the impacts of the crisis on displaced people and returnees; helping affected people to exchange aid dependence for a degree of autonomy and self-reliance even while still displaced; tackling menaces like rising acute food insecurity and

threats of communicable disease outbreak; and taking opportunities for principled alternate and durable solutions where feasible. Urgent life-saving actions are still needed on a considerable scale, but these and accompanying actions should be aligned and mainstreamed across sectors to address immediate, short, medium and longer term needs of affected populations.

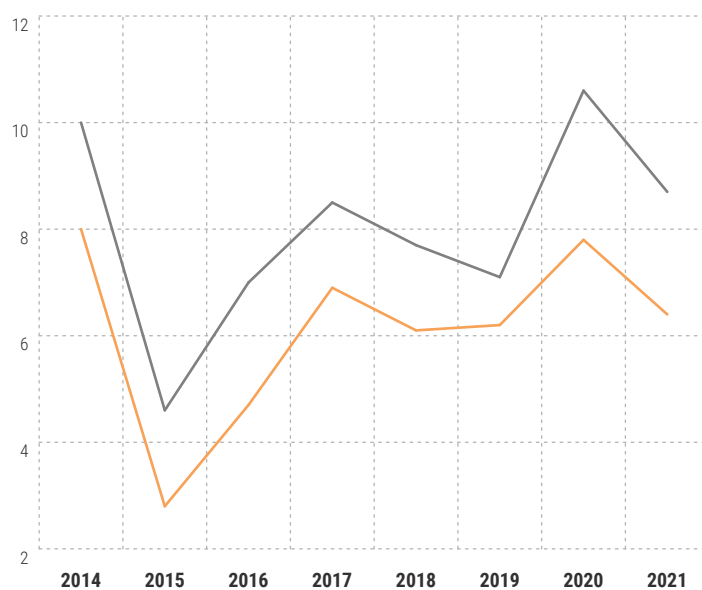

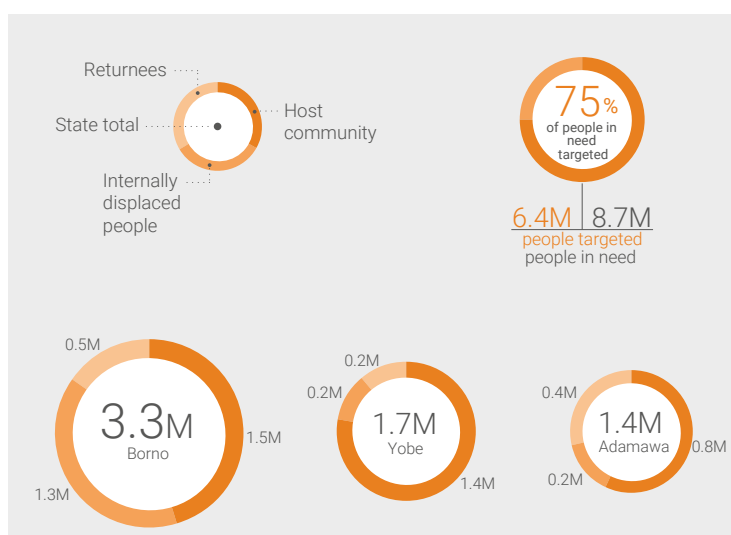

### PEOPLE TARGETED IN 2021 BY STATE

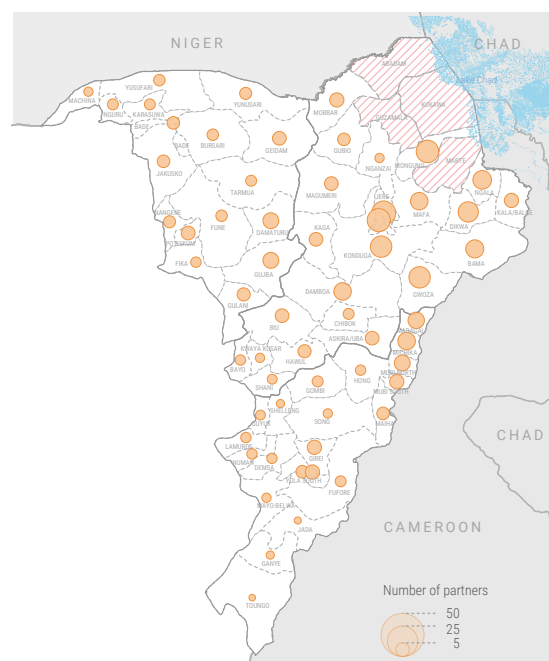
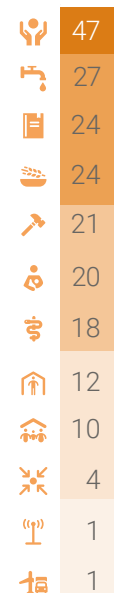
