

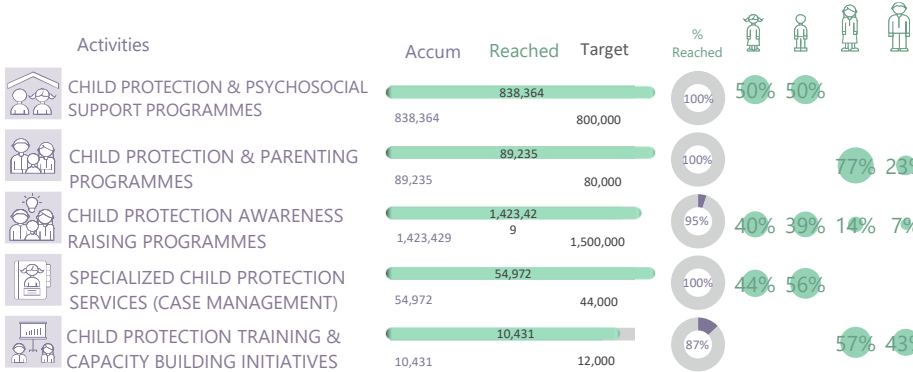
WHOLE OF SYRIA CHILD PROTECTION AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY: RESPONSE SNAPSHOT

January to December 2018



The Child Protection Area of Responsibility in Syria is comprised of approximately 148 agencies including, UN, INGO, Syrian NGO and government agencies operating in 14 governorates. Members work to prevent and respond to abuse, neglect, exploitation and violence against children through strengthening community-based child protection programming, including psychosocial support, providing specialized child protection services and strengthening the capacity of frontline child protection workers and volunteers.

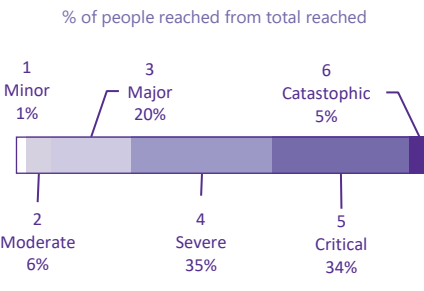

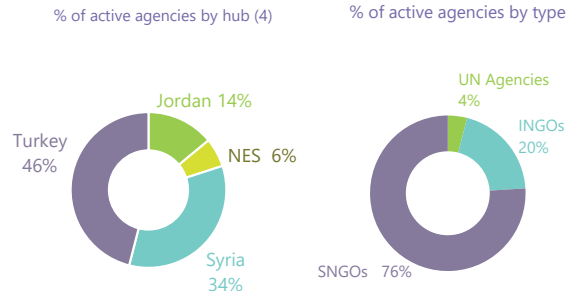

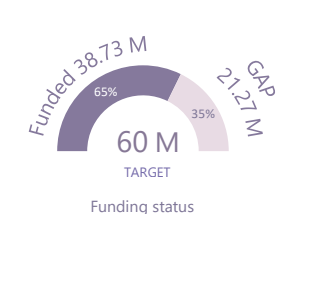

KEY RESPONSE FIGURES

Increased and more equitable access for boys and girls to quality child protection interventions in targeted locations in line with the Child Protection Minimum Standards

CHILD PROTECTION & PSYCHOSOCIAL SUPPORT PROGRAMMES

During the reporting period, 838,364 children (50% girls and 50% boys) were reached with PSS across 51 Districts in 14 Governorates. Activities include only "sustained" and "structured" child protection and PSS interventions. "Sustained" refers to a) an ongoing programme (not one type of events) and b) regular attendance over a specific period of time. "Structured" refers to programmes that include a specific curriculum and/or structured sessions. This year Child protection Members are working to review and strengthen guidance for delivery of quality age and gender sensitive PSS and improve coordination with MHPSS WG and Health cluster.

CHILD PROTECTION AWARENESS RAISING PROGRAMMES

During the reporting period, 1,423,429 individuals were reached across 56 districts in 14 governorates with community events, communication campaigns addressing specific Child Protection issues including Risk Education, prevention of separation, prevention of violence. Child Protection Members should expand awareness activities involving community members and adult population.

SPECIALIZED CHILD PROTECTION SERVICES (CASE MANAGEMENT)

During the reporting period, 54,972 vulnerable and at risk children (44% girls and 56% boys) were reached across 56 districts in 14 governorates through case management service and therefore identified, assessed, re-referred to essential services (medical support, interim care, psychosocial support, legal assistance, safety and security, etc.) and supported with a care plan by trained caseworkers. Specialized services need to be expanded across the country.

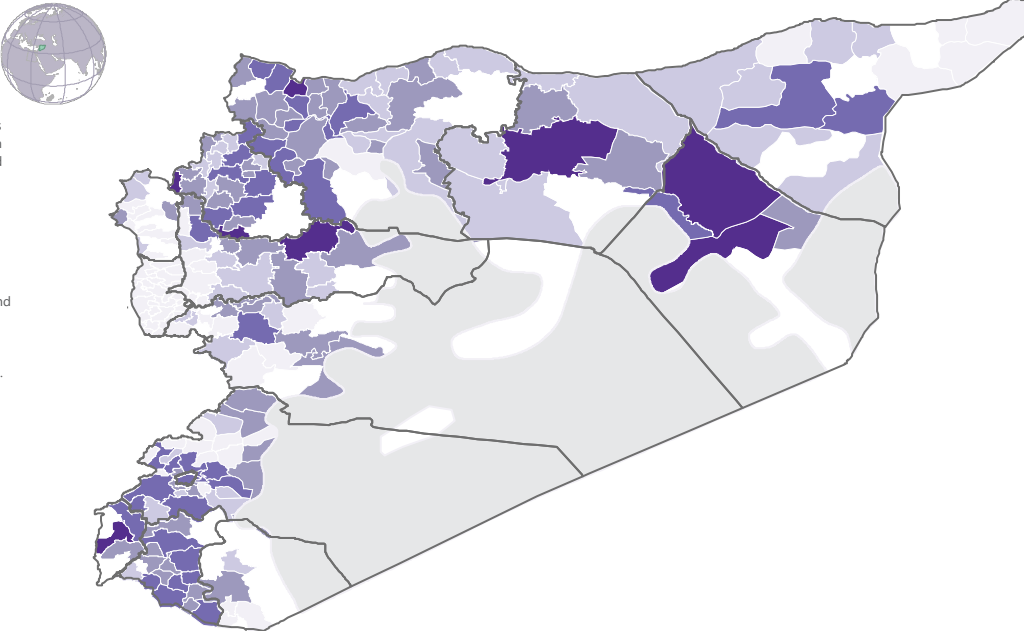
CHILD PROTECTION & PARENTING PROGRAMMES

During the reporting period, 89,235 caregivers (77% women and 23% men) across 46 districts in 14 governorates participated in parenting programs that helped them to understand child development and positive discipline, how to prevent and respond to protection risks for children and equip them with coping strategies also through parents support groups. Child Protection Members need to strengthen this component in their current programming and target more male caregivers.

CHILD PROTECTION TRAINING & CAPACITY BUILDING INITIATIVES

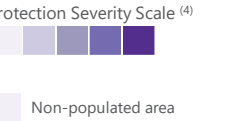
During the reporting period, 10,431 individuals (57% woman, 43% men) across 37 districts in 13 governorates were involved in capacity building initiative targeting CP workers, frontline service providers and volunteers (e.g. case management, CP Minimum Standards, PSS and Psychological First Aid). Strengthen the capacity of Members to deliver specialized services (child survivors, children with disabilities) remains one of the core focus of CP sector for 2018.
