OVERVIEW

The South Sudan Humanitarian Fund (SSHf) allocated US\$34.7 million to 48 humanitarian partners under the first standard allocation of 2020, targeting an estimated 1.6 million vulnerable people. The allocation provided much-needed resources for frontline activities under the 2020 Humanitarian Response Plan (HRP). It inaugurated OCHA as the Managing Agent of the SSHf.¹

To respond to COVID-19, organizations funded under the allocation will be able to re-programme² 15 per cent of their budgeted activities in line with the COVID-19 Addendum to the HRP. With this, \$5.2 million of the total allocation will be used for COVID-19 response.

The allocation prioritized a multi-cluster approach. A total of \$20 million was spent on integrated projects between at least two clusters and \$14.7 million on single-cluster projects. Larger-scale projects were funded to minimize fragmentation and increase effectiveness. The project implementation period was extended from 6 to 9-12 months to ensure sustainability of interventions.

The SSHf continued to promote the localization agenda by channelling 44 per cent of the allocated funds to national non-governmental organizations (NNGOs). To promote partnerships amongst humanitarian organizations, SSHf provided flexibility for partners to collaborate with NNGOs on multi-cluster projects. These sub-implementing partners (sub-IPs) will contribute to the expected achievements outlined below and benefit from mentorships with their partner organizations. Seventeen NNGOs were contracted as sub-IPs, with \$5.3 million channelled indirectly to them. Combined with direct funding, this brings the total amount of SSHf funds from the first standard allocation to NNGOs to \$15.4 million.

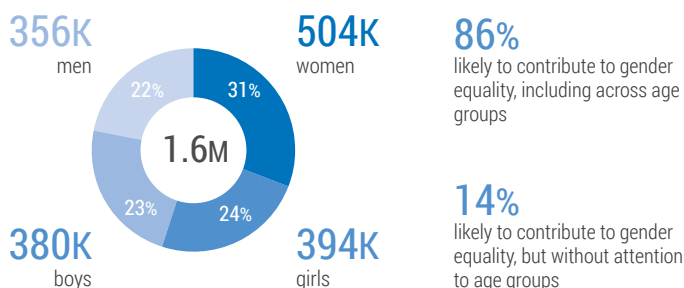

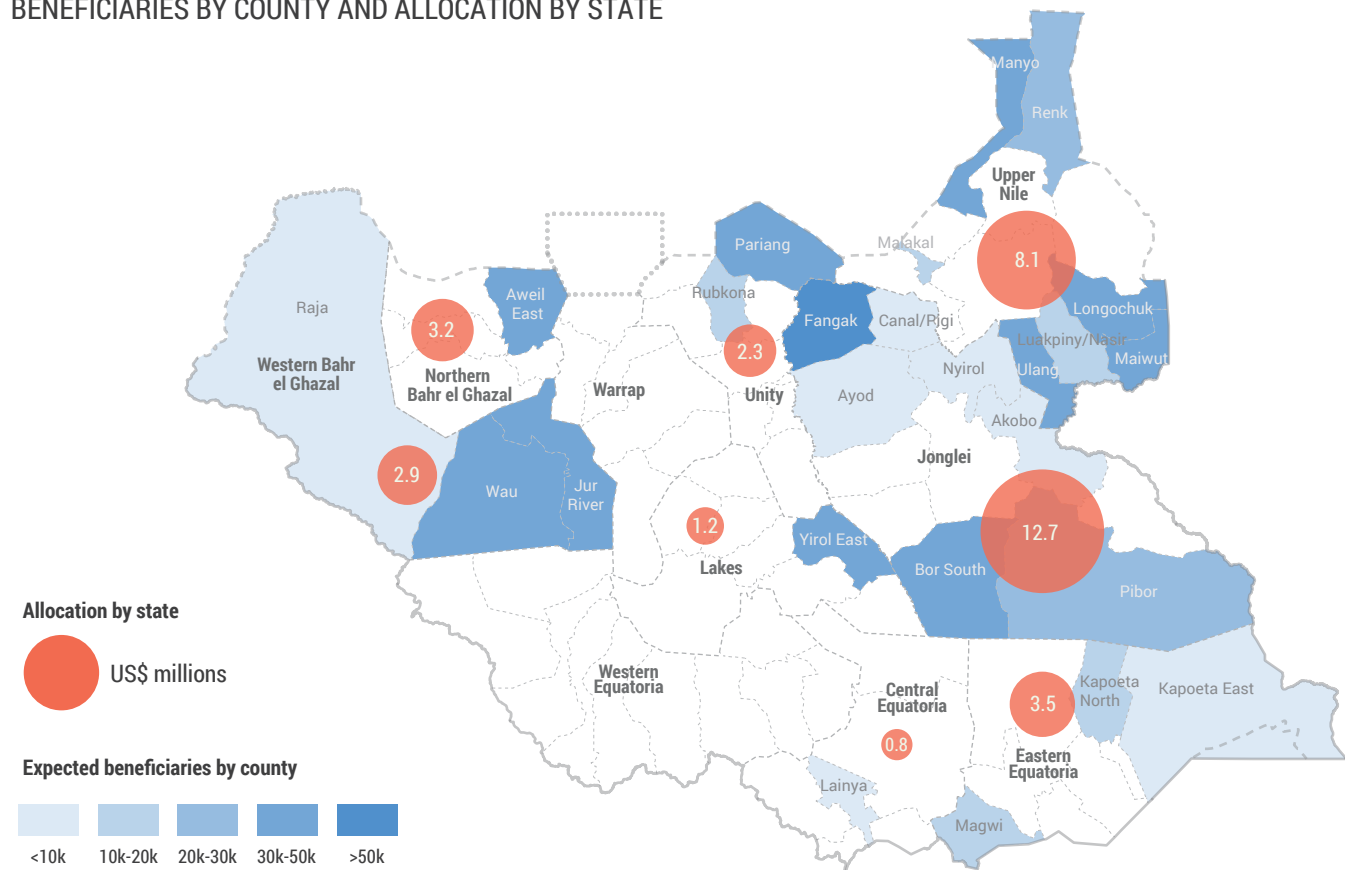

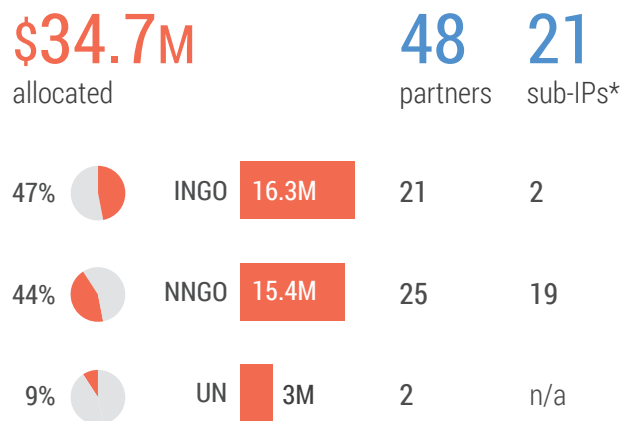
BENEFICIARIES BY GENDER AND AGE



BENEFICIARIES BY COUNTY AND ALLOCATION BY STATE

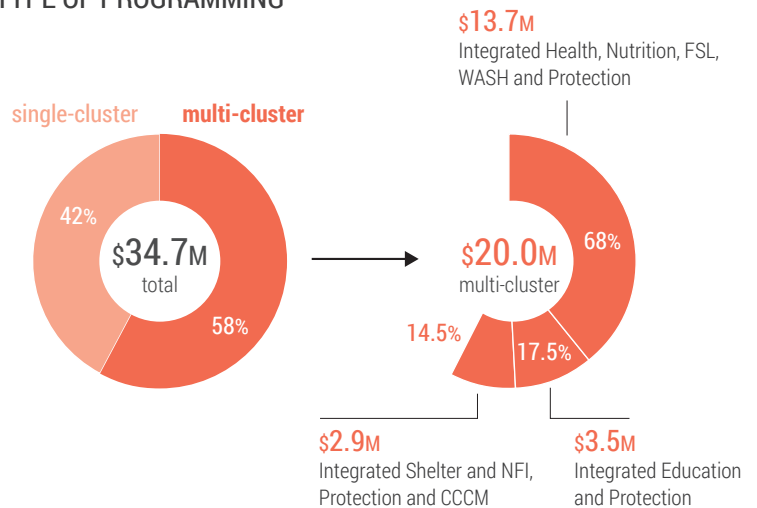


ALLOCATION BY PARTNER TYPE
