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HIGHLIGHTS

- **Improving Health Access and Scaling up Responsiveness:**

During the month of October 2019, 194 normal deliveries were attended by skilled birth attendants.

There were 177,236 outpatients consultation provided for common illness during the month of October.

- **Prevent, detect and respond to epidemic prone disease outbreaks:**

In October 2019 averagely 76% epidemic prone disease alerts were verified and responded to within 48 hours.

A total of 1,237 children (6 months to 15 years) were vaccinated against measles in October.

- **Quality Essential Clinical Health Services**

In October around 120 new Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM) children with complications were treated in stabilization centres.


4 health facilities are reported providing sexual and gender based violence (SGBV) services and five SGBV survivors received clinical management of rape (CMR) services.

- **Improving Resilience- Mental Health Response:**


Eighty seven beneficiaries received Mental Health and Psychosocial Support (MPHSS) in conflict affected areas.

Two health facilities are reported providing MPHSS services in vulnerability settings.

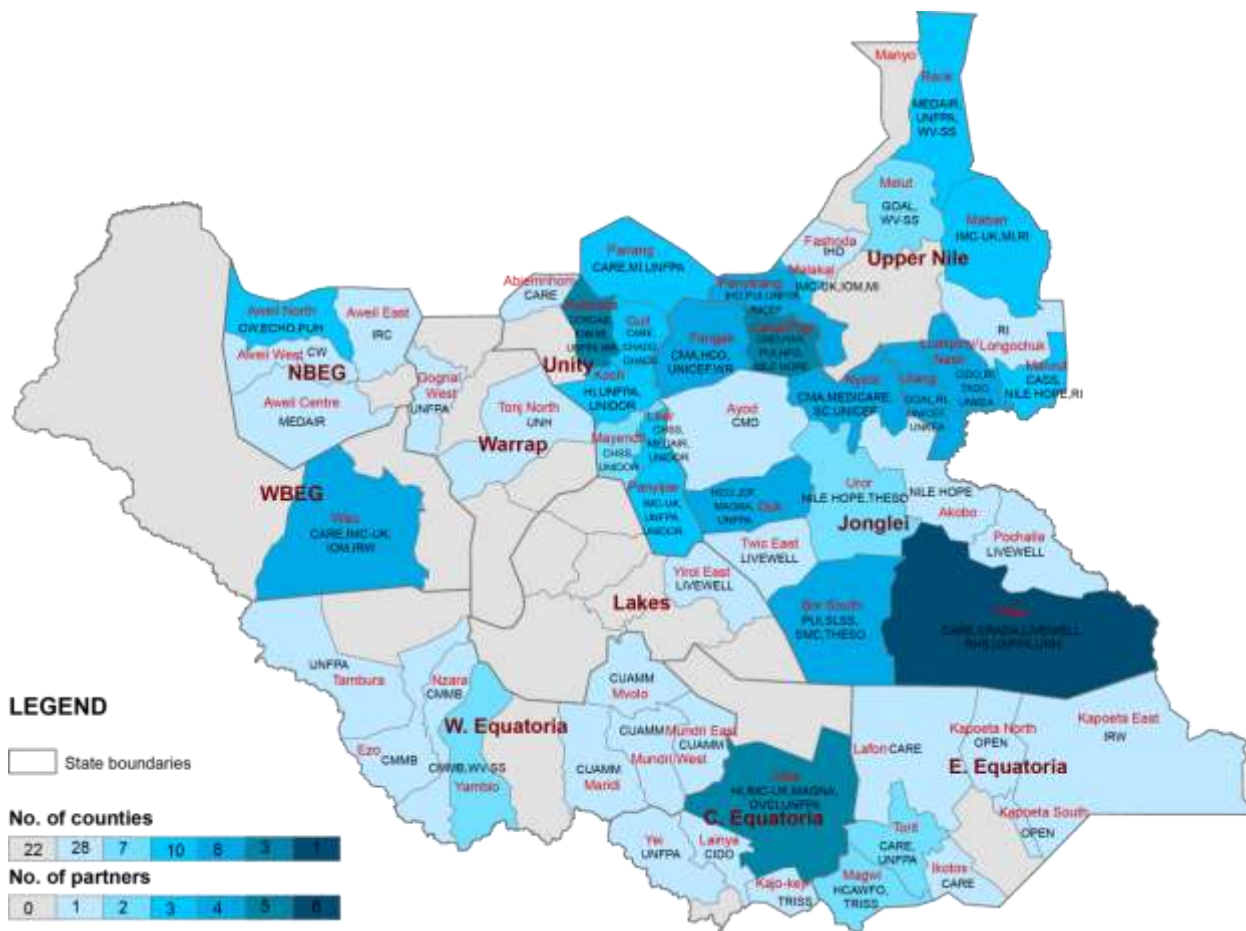

Operational Presence of Partners

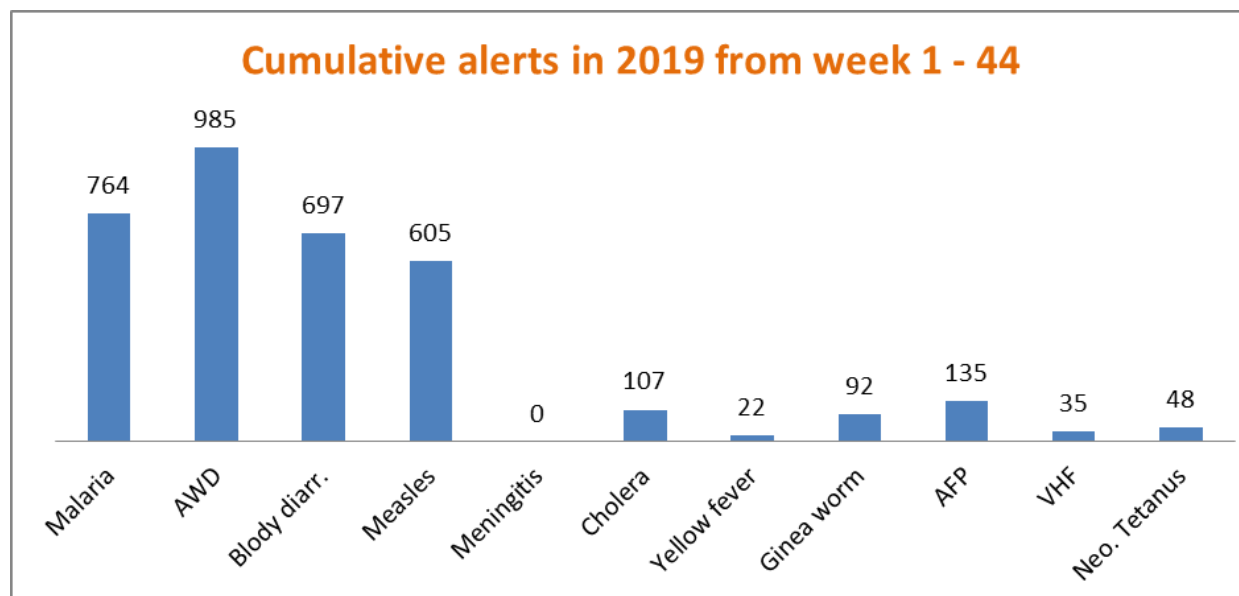
- According to 5W data submitted during January till September 2019, all 54 HRP partners reported data at least once by month.
- During this period partners were present in 57 counties. There were 28 counties with single partner present, 7 counties with 2 partners, 10 counties with 3 partners, 8 counties with 4 partners, 3 counties with 5 partners and 1 county with 6 partners present.

KEY CONTEXT UPDATE

Public Health Risks and Key Gaps

- In October averagely 75% of alerts were verified 3% were risk assessed and 2% required a response. Malaria, AWD, measles and bloody diarrhoea were the top common alerts generated through the EWARS in , 2019.
- A measles outbreak confirmed in Li-bodo, Yambio after four (4) suspect measles cases tested IgM positive. At least 16 cases including one death have been line listed. MSF-E and partners have started a reactive campaign on 21th October targeting 30,000 children aged 6 – 59 months. SMOH, MSF and partners conducted a reactive campaign with a coverage of 63% (preliminary report)
- Confirmed measles outbreak in Budi after ten (10) suspect measles cases tested IgM positive. At least 14 cases including one death have been line listed. Plans for reactive measles campaign is ongoing.
- Measles outbreaks confirmed in 2019 in 17 counties and 04 PoC sites. New confirmed measles outbreaks with planned response in Budi and completed response in Jur River, Tonj South , Pibor – Labarab and Maruwa and Yambio

- Since week 7 of 2019, a total of 204 ILI/SARI samples have been collected and tested in UVRI 153 being negative; 2 (1%) positive for Influenza B (Victoria); 11 (6%) positive for Influenza A (H3); and 1(1%) positive for Influenza A (H1)pdm09 and no samples pending test results .



MEASLES OUTBREAK

- In 2019 Measles outbreaks is confirmed in 17 counties (Pibor; Abyei; Mayom; Gogrial West; Aweil South; Melut; Gogrial East; Juba; Tonj North; Aweil West; Aweil East; Renk; Wau; Tonj North; Jur River; Yambio and Budi) and 4 PoC sites (Wau PoC AA; Bentiu PoC; Malakal PoC; & Juba PoC).
- Status of Measles campaign status:
 - Budi; campaign planned for 18th November, 2019
 - Tonj South; completed
 - Jur River; completed
 - Pibor – Labarab and Maruwa; completed
 - Yambio; completed

PARTNER IMPLEMENTATION KEY HIGHLIGHTS

Christian Recovery and Development Agency (CRADA)

- CRADA is supporting primary health care services through 1 PHCUs and one Mobile Clinic in Pibor and one PHCU in Koch County under South Sudan Humanitarian Fund (SSHF).
- Total consultation curatives in month of October reached 3,040 patients whose 1161(530 boys and 631 girls) under five years and 1879(697 male and 1,182 female) above five years.
- A total of 77 children under one years received Penta3 and 212 were vaccinated against measles
- 2 Community meeting were conducted and 1 meeting with County Health Department(CHD)
- 4 IDSR reports were submitted through EWARS.
- Top three causes of morbidity were Malaria(489 under five years), Diarrhea (259 under five years and Pneumonia (165 under five years)
- A total of 91 pregnant women visited health facilities for antennal care whose 57 for ANC1 and 35 for ANC4.

Healthcare foundation Organization (HFO)

- 1,057 beneficiaries get health service from two mobile clinics in Diel and Atar payams during the month of October 2019.
- 211 mothers were given ANC services in Canal/Pigi County.
- 432 children aged 6-59 months and 343 PLWs were screened in two mobile clinics under SSHF project.
- In Twic County an assessment was done in September 2019 with staff recruitment confirmed to start early October 2019.
- 5,191 beneficiaries attended through OPD consultation to treat common illnesses in 5 health facilities Juaibor PHCC, Keew PHCC, Pulite PHCU, Paguir PHCU and Kuerpon PHCU, in Fangak county under World Bank project
- 464 mothers were given ANC services in Fangak County.
- 890 children aged 6-59 months and 1,112 PLWs were screened through MUAC during the month of October 2019.

Impact Health Organization (IHO)

- 942 individuals including boys, girls, men and women were reached through health education.
- There were 871 general consultations out of which 122 were children under five years.
- 541 uncomplicated cases of malaria treated with ACTs both under five and above five.
- 621 individuals tested with malaria RDTs of which 541 tested positive for malaria.
- 22 pregnant women attended Antenatal care services,
- 96 children under 5 years were screened for SAM and MAM and 6 were MAM and 2 SAM.
- 7 individuals were received psychosocial support.



John Dau Foundation (JDF)

- JDF has conducted routine health services in Twic East and Duk County respectively reaching 6,488 above 5 years and older and 8,798 under 5 years through consultations;
- At least 4,075 children under 5 received malaria treatment with 5,316 5yrs & above received malaria treatment.
- 161 adults received STIs treatment according to syndromic approach,
- 284 the mothers attended ANC services first visit, while with fourth visit were 99 mothers.
- Also 182 mothers received IPT2 while 150 mothers were counseled & tested for HIV at PMCT of which 1 mother was positive and integrated to program of ARV .
- In the same month, 110 mothers delivered at health facilities by skilled birth attendants. 168 children less than 5yrs were treated for Diarrhea with ORS.
- In the same month 82 children under 5yrs were treated for pneumonia.
- At least 341 children from 6 months-59 months were vaccinated with measles (57) children, BCG (91) children OPV 0 (117), OPV1 (90), OPV 2 (70), OPV 3 (65) Penta 1(234), Penta 2(100) Penta



3(105), IPV (97) 117 pregnant mothers TT while 300 women of childbearing age were given (LLITNs) long lasting insecticide treated nets during ANC Visit.

- In addition, 567 bed nets were distributed to under 5yrs during OPD visit.
- 81 people both men and women were enrolled in to family planning method especially oral contraceptives.
- In the same month, 2,451 children under 5 were reached with integrated Community Case Management (ICCM) and 4,950 people were reached with key messages through health education.

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
