1. Welcome	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Salah from DWSU welcomed the participants to this monthly national WASH sector coordination. 	
2. Humanitarian updates	<p>Salah El Siddiq from WASH sector presented the humanitarian updates</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Salah mentioned that during the last month, there were no new emergencies and no major updates on response to existing humanitarian situation. Thus, 2 information are worth to be shared. • Returnees from Chad: 487 Sudanese refugees returned from Chat since November 22. They are entering Sudan through the Tina (ND) and Foro Baranga (WD) where there are assisted. • With recent deterioration of the situation in Sudan, the WASH sector wishes to better understand the humanitarian impacts on the population and on the implementation of ongoing projects. A May 2018, a questionnaire was circulated and it is highly probable that a similar survey will be re-circulate to survey the partners views on the situation. To this, NEF mentioned that they have difficulties to access cash and ARC mentioned that the difficulty to access fuel put some on their project on hold. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • WASH sector, to develop / re-circulate a questionnaire

3. 2018 achievements	<p>Mohammed Abdelhafeez, WASH sector IM officer, presented WASH sector achievement of 2018</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• In 2018, the WASH sector partners reached 2.01 million people, which correspond to 67% of the target of 3 million people and 54% of the 3,8 million of people in need. In 2018, the WASH sector aimed at meeting the people needs of water, sanitation and hygiene interventions under the 3 MYHS outcomes.• In 2018, the WASH sector provided water to 1.6 million; this corresponds to 83% of the target and 67% of the PiN. Similarly, with sanitation and hygiene, 541'000 and 306'000 people were respectively assisted. These achievements represent 35% and 46% of the targeted population and 28% and 37% of the number of people in need. These figures show a gap in the target of respectively 17%, 65% and 54% for water, sanitation and hygiene services.• In 2018, the WASH sector responded to the emergency needs (outcome 1) of 540'000 people, which correspond to 43% of the target population. The WASH sector considers this achievement as a good result as this there has been less emergencies and less emergencies affected people to respond to. With regard to assistance to protracted displaced people, the WASH sector reached 1,9 million people or 67% of its 2.8 million people target. Finally, for outcome 3, the WASH sector met only 10% of the expected targets.• In 2018, WASH sector has conducted relief activities in 10 localities. The localities that present the largest WASH gaps are Gedaref and Red Sea. These 2 localities present high level of malnutrition and, as this is chronic situation that attract less fund, the WASH partners working in those localities aren't sufficient to address the needs. Thus, people in need in 7 localities have been covered quite adequately by the WASH sector as the achievement compared to the needs almost reach 80%.

4. 2019 HRP plan	<p>Mohammed Abdelhafeez, WASH sector IM officer, presented the updated WASH sector HRP plan. He emphasized on the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Number of affected population have finally been confirmed by HAC / OCHA and based on these updated figures, the WASH sector updated the 2019 HRP planning exercise. Some of the targets submitted by partners had to be modified to adapt to the updated PiN per localities. The updates targets were shared with the sector partners are to be used in OPS which should open from Jan 23 to 30.• For the 2019 exercise, the PiN is 2,86 million and the number of targeted people is 2,37 million.
