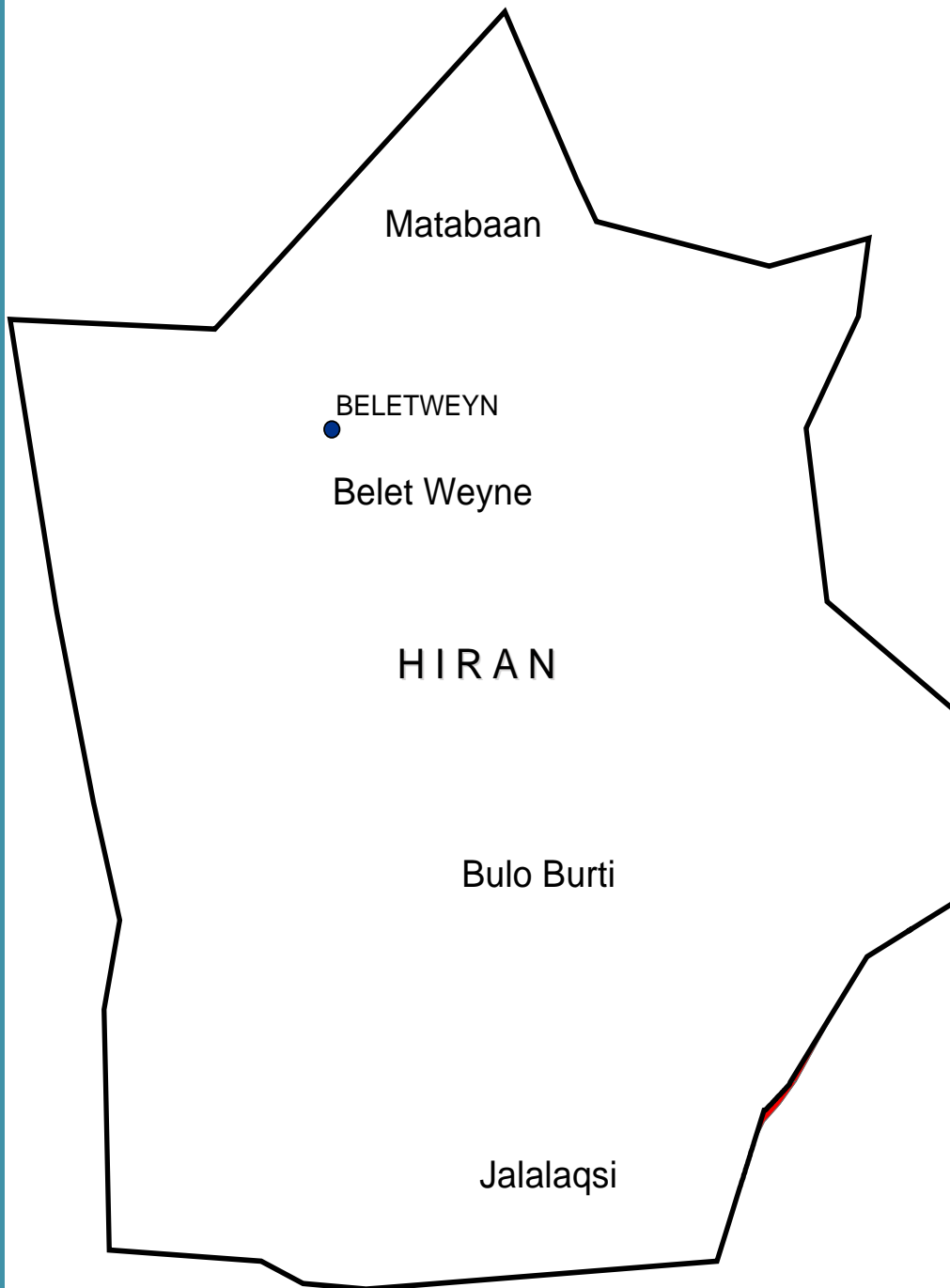

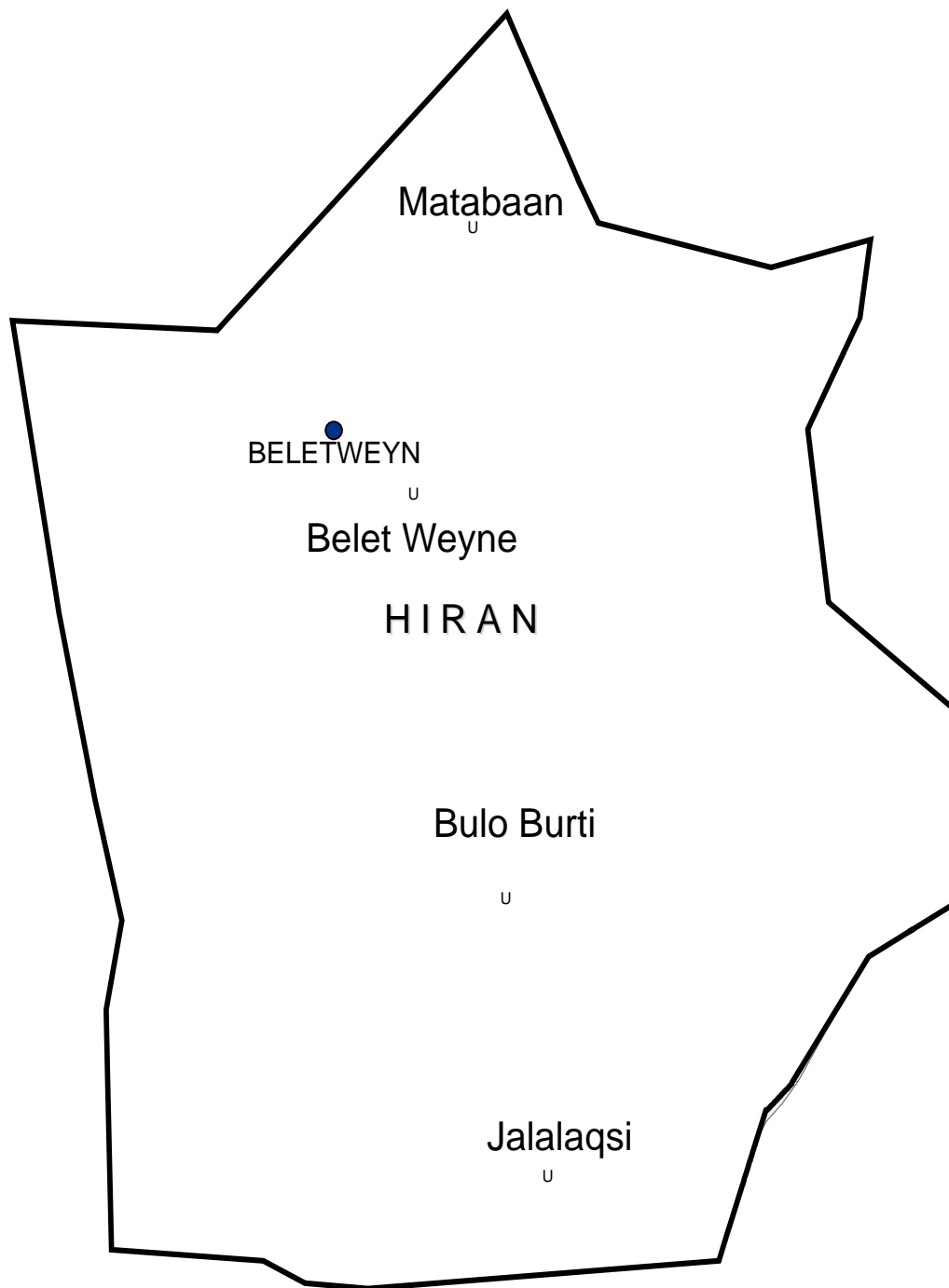

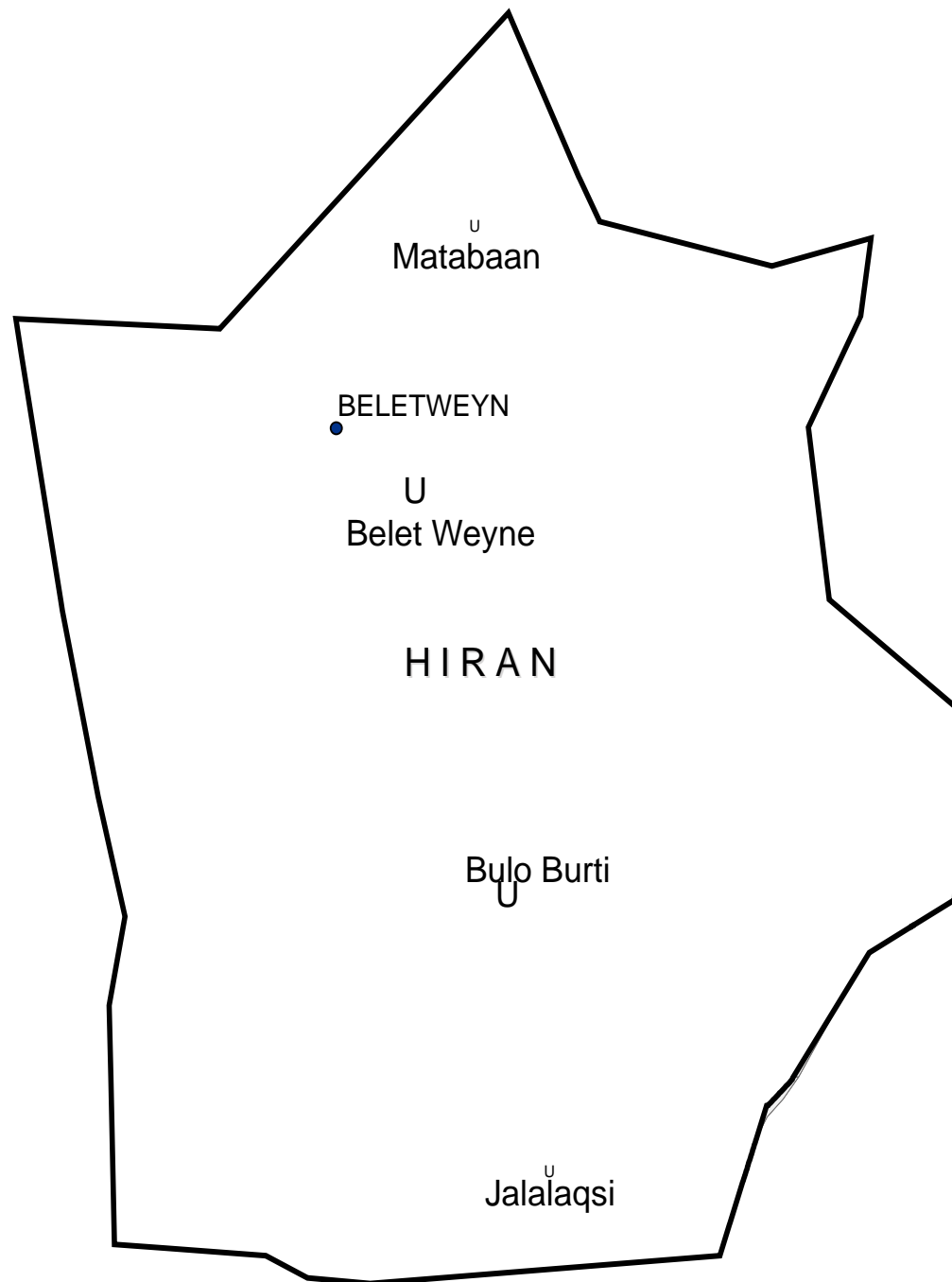



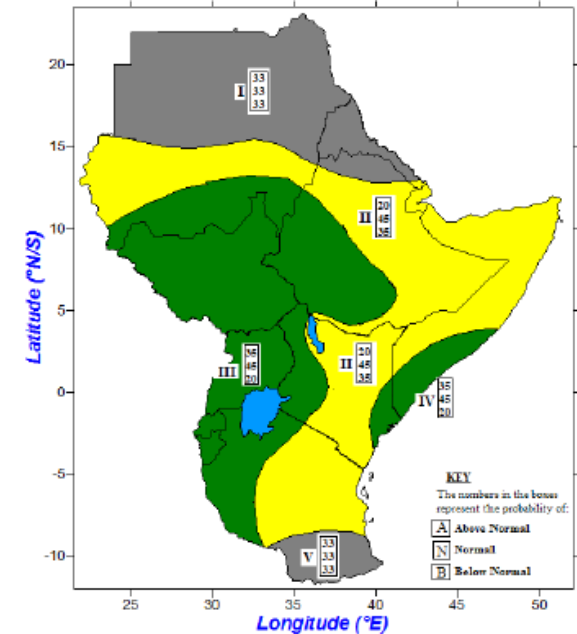


Deyr 2013 Outlook October to December

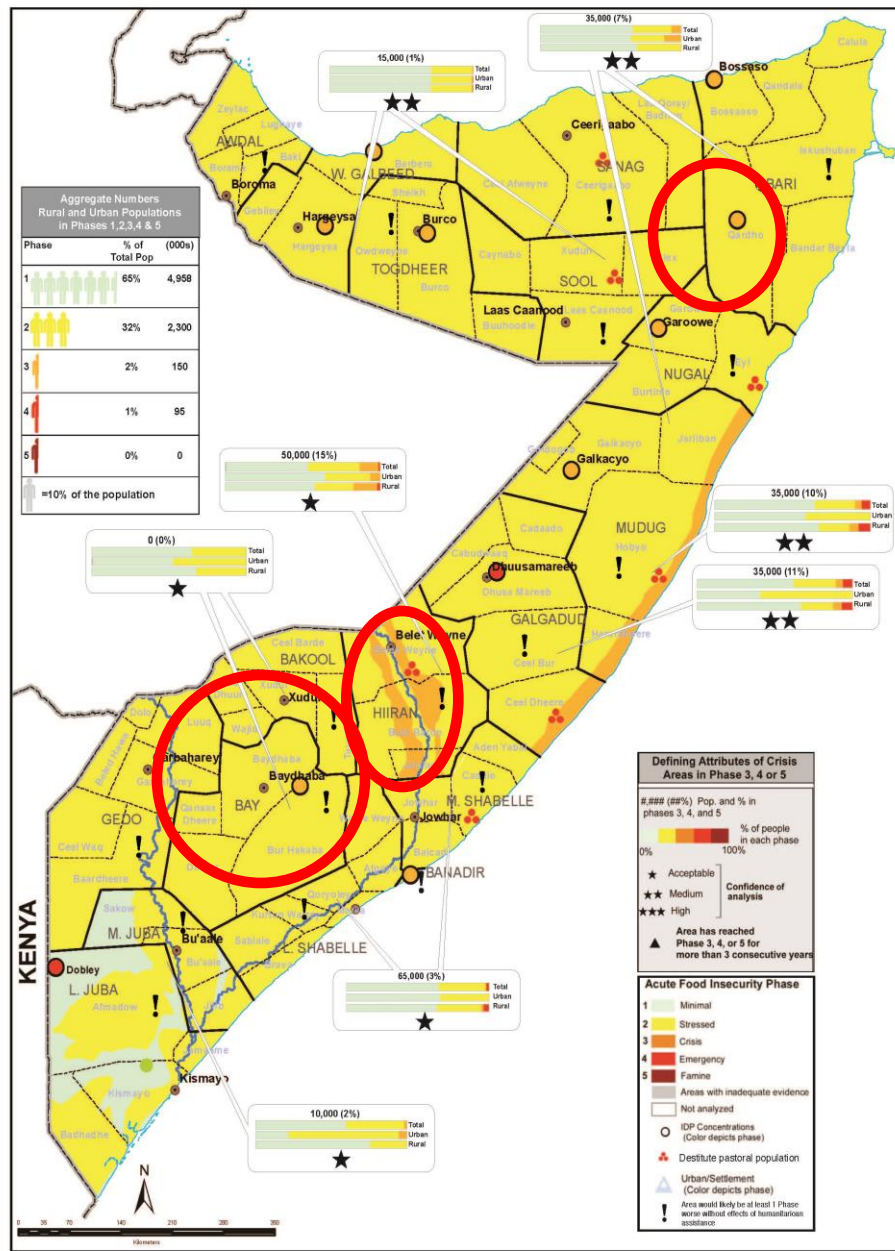


FORECAST

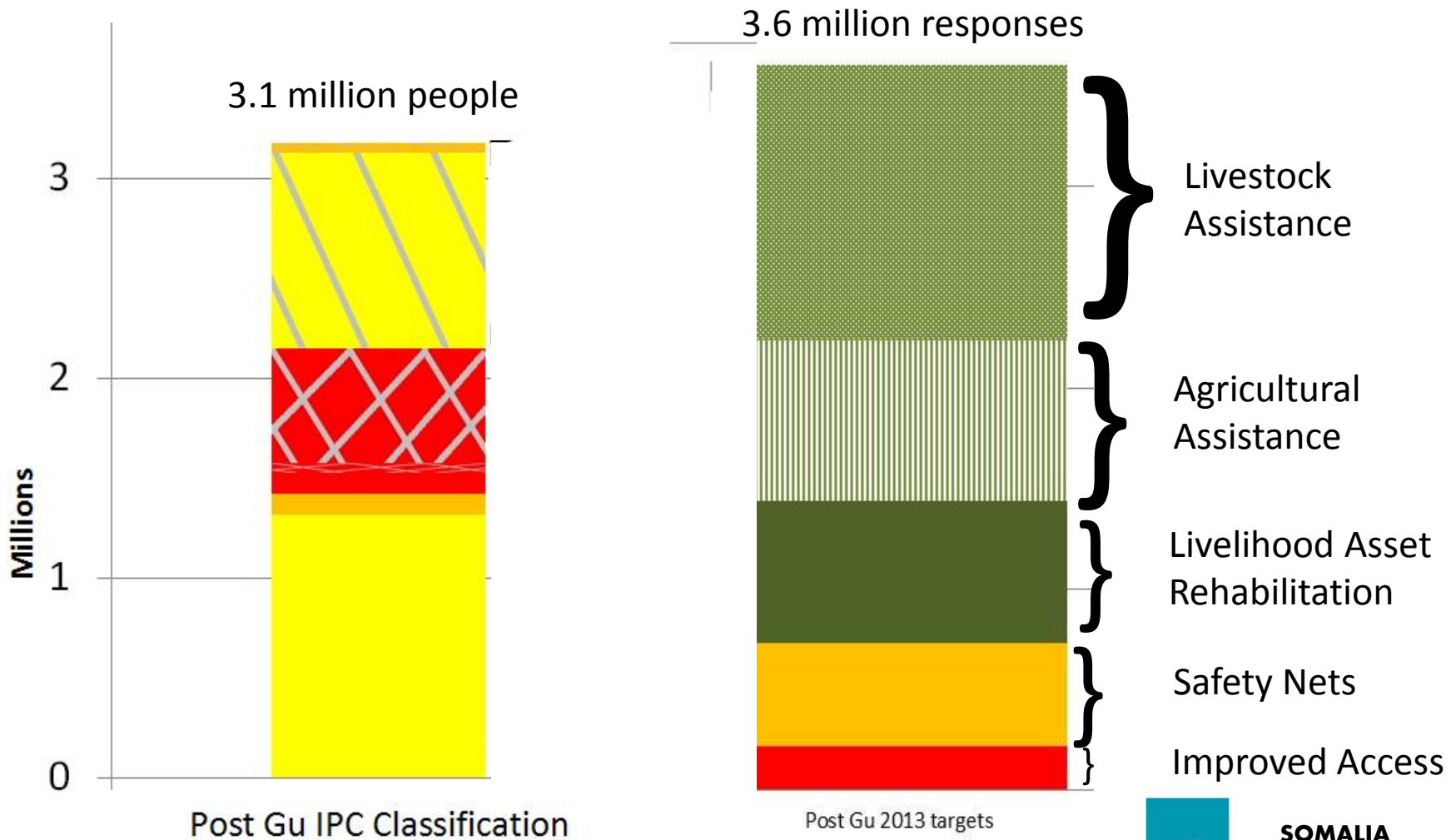
- Increased probability below-average *Deyr* rainfall
- Rains may start late
- Erratic distribution (time & space) particularly in October & November
