Objectives



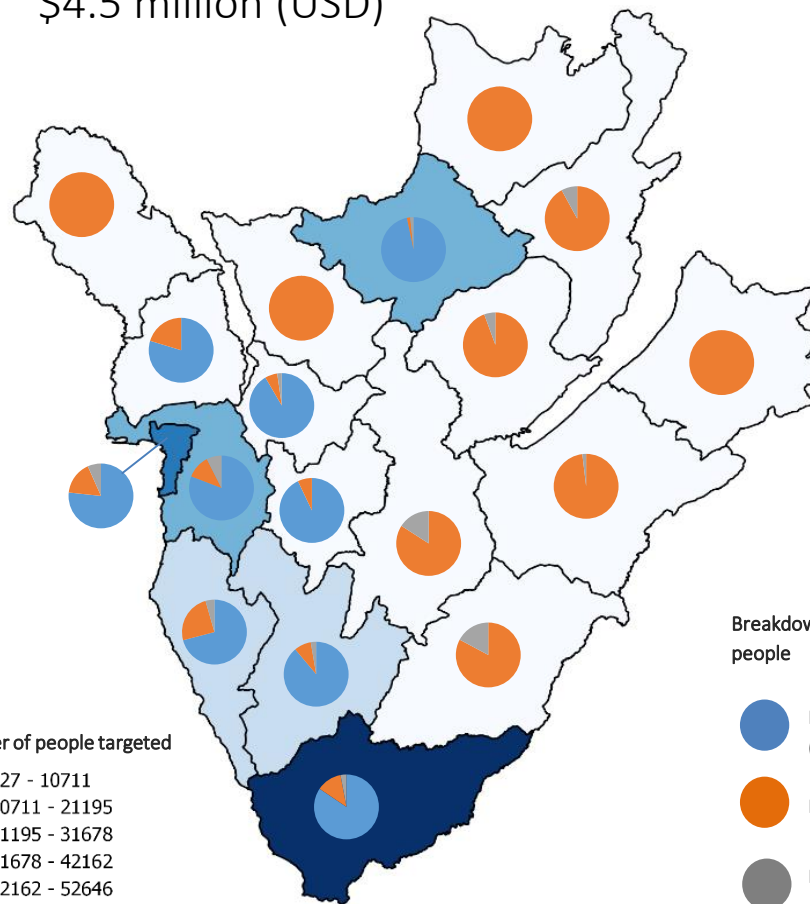
Children affected by the sociopolitical crisis and natural disasters have access to quality education in a healthy and protective environment.



Crisis-affected children have access to education adapted to their socioemotional needs.



The capacity of education services are reinforced in preparedness, disaster risk, and emergency management.





[The Burundi EiE WG strategy](#) aims to support crisis-affected school-aged (3-18) children and youth, girls and boys, as well as education personnel (teachers—including volunteers, principals, advisers, etc.), and other community members (parents, school management committees, etc.).

The involvement and strengthening of learning communities (i.e. all stakeholders, e.g. students, personnel, parent teacher associations, school clubs, etc.) in strategic activities* will help ensure the sustainability of these actions and the outcomes achieved. The same approach will be used in IDP host communities to support the wellbeing of students, the integration of displaced children in local education communities, and overall social cohesion.

HOW FAR CAN A DOLLAR GO?

- With 21¢ you provide a student with one school meal.
- With \$1 you contribute to sensitizing a learning community member on risks in and around school and how to mitigate them.
- With \$1.50 you provide a student kit to a child in need.
- With \$3 you contribute to sensitizing a student on preparedness and disaster management.
- With \$10 you provide a pedagogical kit to a teacher in need.
- With \$30 you contribute to training an educator on child rights in emergencies.
- With \$45 you contribute to training a learning community member on conflict prevention and management.
- With \$75 you contribute to training an educator on psychosocial first aid.
- With \$5,000 you contribute to setting up a temporary learning space in an area hit by natural disaster and/or with a high concentration of IDPs.
- With \$7,000 you contribute to restoring a classroom damaged by natural disaster.
